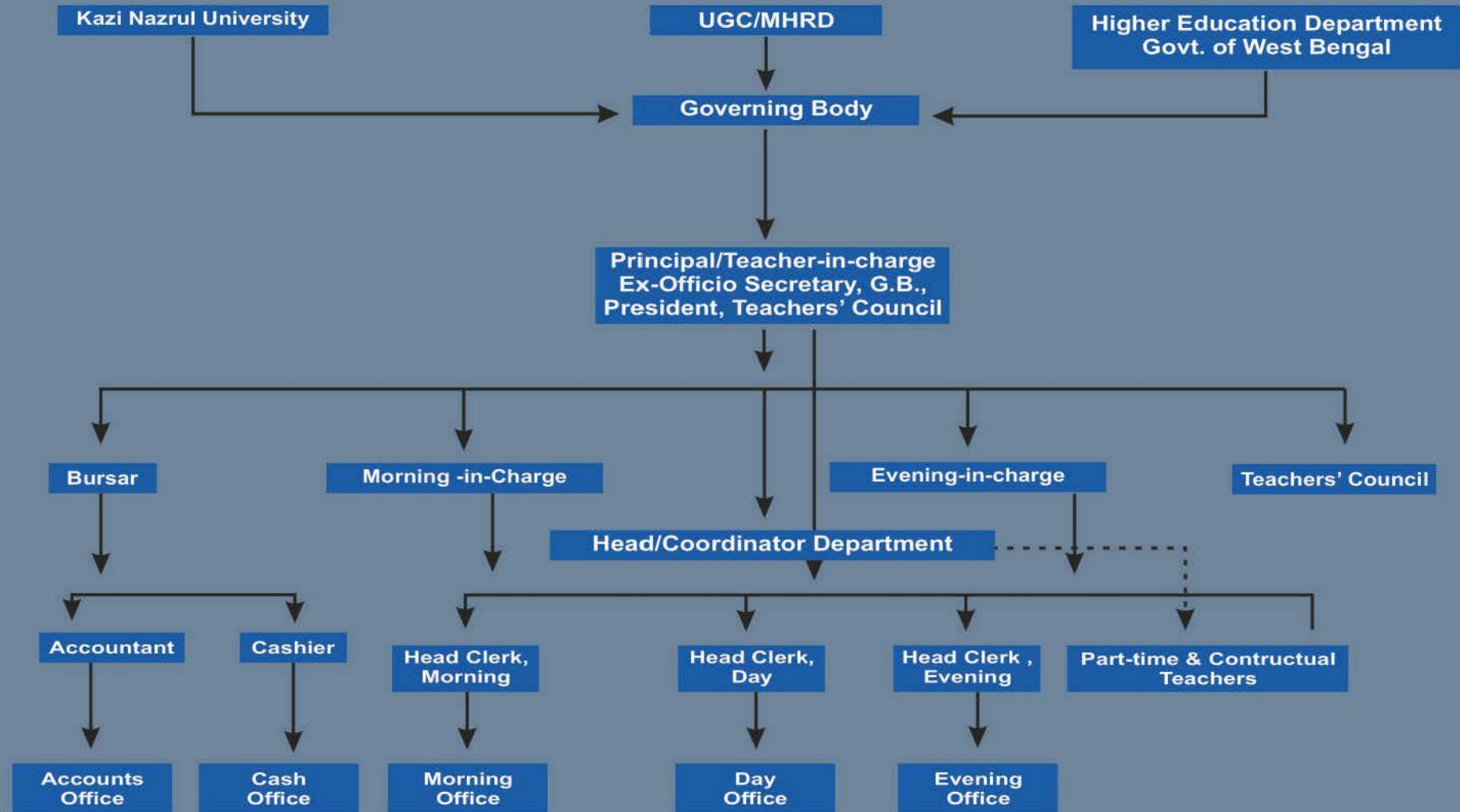

By the early 1940s, Asansol was established as an important industrial belt and thereafter arose the need to boost educational facilities in the area. With such an objective in mind, Prof. Satyakali Mukherjee submitted a proposal to inaugurate a college for the first time in Asansol to the then chairman of Asansol Municipality Mr. Jogendranath Roy and the then S. D. O. Mr. Woodford, I.C.S. This noble endeavor was supported by eminent personalities of the day as well as the general populace, who donated generously for the establishment of a higher educational institution.

Owing to the initiative taken by Mr. G.S. Atwal, a business luminary of the day, the institution came into being on 16th July 1944, with strength of 132 students, enrolled in the I. A. class. Asansol College, as it came to be known, was affiliated to the University of Calcutta. It was originally situated at Atwal Nagar (presently Budha Nagar, Asansol). Later, with a magnanimous donation from Late Banwarilal Bhalotia, the present main building was constructed on an acquired land of 20 bighas. The foundation stone was laid by Dr. Bidhan Chandra Roy. The newly-constructed college building (the present Old Building of the college) was inaugurated by the then Vice Chancellor of Burdwan University, Sri S.K. Guha, and the college was renamed Banwarilal Bhalotia College.

Presently affiliated to Kazi Nazrul University, B. B. College is one of the leading educational institutions in Asansol, providing both general and technology-based education. The college is blessed with a beautiful campus, spacious classrooms, well-equipped laboratories, adequate computer labs, well-stocked libraries and a playground. Besides traditional undergraduate and post-graduate courses in various subjects of Arts, Commerce and Science streams, the college, in tune with the changing needs of higher education, has introduced courses like B.B.A., B.C.A., Environmental Sciences and Water Management, and training courses in dry farming, cultivation of aromatic and medicinal plants, mushroom, lac cultivation, vermi-composting, sericulture and soil water analysis. The college runs three distance education centres of IGNOU, NSOU and MANUU. In 2010, the college was declared as "Centre with Potential for Excellence" by the UGC. In 2011, it received Rs. 50,000 as seed money for the development of Basic Scientific Research (BSR). In 2012, the UGC introduced three career-oriented courses in Functional English, Mobile Repairing and Vermi-composting, which were run successfully by the college for three years. The college has been re-accredited (cycle 2) by the NAAC with grade B+ in 2020. We are confident that, with honest and diligent effort, we will scale greater heights in future.

- B. B. College has adopted a village called Namojamdoba, situated in the district of Paschim Bardhaman, West Bengal. We have put in an honest effort to ensure that our lesser-privileged brothers and sisters become self-sufficient through various practices that the College pilots for their economic and social advancement. For instance, the College has trained the rearing and cultivation of tasar silkworms, advanced methods of paddy cultivation, vermicomposting, and various other activities. - The administration of the college adheres to absolute transparency in financial, administrative and other areas. Admission is a fair, online process which is strictly based on merit, and in accordance with the government's reservation policy. The portal for online admission is visible on the institutional website. All academic and non-academic activities of the college are strictly monitored by various committees under the aegis of IQAC, to ensure smooth and non-prejudiced functioning. The books of accounts of the college are subjected to internal audit by qualified Chartered Accountants which are followed by statutory audit by the Government appointed auditor, to ensure financial discipline. Further, all transactions are routed through banks

- B. B. College is committed to provide value-based education to the highest possible number of candidates. However, like in the case of any other higher educational institution, we are constrained by rules and regulations set forth by the UGC and our affiliating university. Thus, many interested candidates are not able to enroll themselves to our full-time courses. Various academic, social and financial challenges often keep large sections of our society beyond the purview of conventional modes of education. In order to cater to such pressing needs, the College runs three Distance Education Centres to provide quality education, with proper recognition and affiliation, to a large number of people. These Distance Education Centres include Netaji Subhash Open University (NSOU), Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU), and Maulana Azad National Urdu University (MANUU).

The construction of Hindi-shift building was completed in all respects (including water connection, electricity, drainage and boundary wall). Classes for the Hindi shift scheduled to start in the forthcoming session in the new building.

A new road was constructed to connect the Hindi-shift building to the college and CCTV was installed for safety and security.

The construction of a garden, along with a fountain, facing the Arts Building has enhanced the beauty of our campus. The college has also undertaken a Mulberry Project in joint collaboration with West Bengal Sericulture Department.

A new concrete road has been completed in place of the kaccha road in college campus, starting from G. T. Road college gate.

A central computer Lab has been constructed inside the college campus. The Lab is utilized for conducting internal assessments online, and for classes whenever necessary.

To create better sports facilities for our students, the college playground was renovated and the drainage system has been improvised so that there is no water logging in the playground.

Paschim Bardhaman District Youth Science fair competition 2018-19 was held on 14th & 15th Sept 2018 in our College and our students from Physics department were awarded first prize.

Student Youth Cultural Programme 2018-19 of Youth and Sports deptt, Govt. of W.B., was successfully organised in our college.

The College completed its 75 years and as a part of Platinum Jubilee Celebration, series of year-long cultural programmes, seminars, quiz and sports competitions were organized, along with a Grand Platinum Jubilee Rally (held on 2nd February, 2019).

New Hindi Shift building was inaugurated by Dr. Partha Chatterjee, Hon'ble Minister, Deptt. of Higher Education, W.B, in presence of Sri Moloy Ghatak, G.B President and Hon'ble Minister Law & Labour & P.H.E. Deptt, Govt. of W.B.

Concretization of roads was completed. Green saplings were planted to further beautify our campus and add to its environment-friendly nature.

After a lot of hard work, we have successfully conducted online internal examinations for students all semesters. Another Green Generator of 64.5 KB has been installed in addition to the two existing green generators.

Various other note-worthy events of the session include:

- New canteen has started functioning amidst a beautiful ambience.
- New paver block road has been constructed in front of the administrative building, to the backside of the canteen.
- Two new badminton courts have been constructed, one for boys and another for girls.
- Girls' Common Room has been renovated for providing more facilities to our female students.
- Central Computer Lab facilities have been further extended with 30 upgraded computers.
- Number of CCTVs has increased to enhance the surveillance and safety on our campus.
- Classrooms of the all the buildings/blocks have been coloured from inside to enhance its beauty and cleanliness.
- Computer Science department has been shifted to Science and Commerce block and a new upgraded computer lab, exclusively for the Computer Science department, has been set up.

2020-21

- Two more water cooler-cum-purifiers have been installed to provide quality drinking water to the students.
- Security measures have been extended by increasing the number of fire extinguishers by purchasing new ones and refilling old ones.
- The old lights have been replaced by new LED lights and old ceiling fans have been replaced with energy-efficient models to enhance infrastructure and reduce electricity consumption.
- Seven days National Integration Camp of Sports and Youth Department (MHRD) was successfully hosted by our College.
- State Level Inter School and College Quiz Competition was organized by our College.
- District Level Inter College Recitation and Debate Competition was organised by the College on the occasion of International Mother Language Day and International Women's Day, respectively.
- Rain Water Harvesting Project.
- To tackle the lockdown induced by the pandemic, a special portal named “Electronic Resources for Remote Learning During COVID-19” has been generated on the home page of the College Website for the easy access of electronic study materials (including PowerPoint presentations, lecture notes, e-books, video lectures etc.) prepared by our faculty members.
- To enhance the overall academic standard of the College, one International e-Conference and several other Seminars/Webinars/Workshops of State, National and International level have been organized by different Departments, Library and the College under the aegis of IQAC during this pandemic year. Enthusiastic participation of the teachers and the students made all these efforts successful and encouraged us for future endeavours.
- Central Computer Lab has been remodelled with a complete setup of 100 computers where the students have their computer practical classes. This Central Computing facility has also been utilised for Internal Exam purpose and for different competitive exams as conducted by NTA.
- New Certificate courses have been started for our students along conventional degree courses to enhance the skill and quality of the education of the students.
- Some major initiatives have been taken to make the College Campus more eco-friendly (like plantation of trees throughout the year, creating a paperless administrative system & paperless Internal Exam system, installation of rainwater harvesting system, reduction of power consumption, proper waste management, Green Audit etc.). A Nature Club named “Beagle” was formed to enhance awareness and involvement among all the students and staff for a drive towards a more eco-friendly sustainable College Campus along with its surroundings.

- After successfully hosting an international seminar on Sustainable Development, we are going to publish our seminar proceeding, entitled “Revisiting Strategies for Sustainable Development”.
- Initiatives have been taken to develop linkages with different institutions where the students of the College have been registered for internships, workshops, job training (like nursing) etc. Some MoUs have also been signed in this regard.
- Department of Commerce (Hindi Shift) is going to publish the first volume of its departmental journal- “Brain Bloomers”.
- Construction of new state-of-the-art modern library building has begun in earnest.
- Construction of second floor of our Hindi Shift building has begun to cater to the needs of increasing number of Hindi Shift Students.
- Our entire college campus has been lighted with modern, energy-efficient LED lights, granted by the ADDA authority. This has not only further secured our campus, but also added to its radiant splendour, especially during the evenings.

NAAC VISIT: A NOTE-WORTHY ACHIEVEMENT

The highlight of the year 2019 was the much-needed completion of the NAAC accreditation process (cycle 2) of our college. Due to various circumstantial difficulties, the accreditation process of our college was stalled since 2007. Given the present system of functionality of the Higher Education department, it is imperative for all higher educational institutions to be accredited by the NAAC. We were able to successfully undertake this venture under the inspirational leadership of our principal Dr. Amitava Basu. The NAAC Steering Committee, constituted to oversee the NAAC accreditation process, was able to mobilize enthusiastic participation of all teachers, non-teaching staff, students, guardians, alumni and other stake-holders to complete this herculean task.

As per the current proforma of accreditation, about 70% assessment was completed online. The remaining 30% of the assessment process was completed by the honourable members of the NAAC Peer Team, who visited our college on 13th and 14th December, 2019. The Peer Team members expressed satisfaction over most of our academic and co-curricular infrastructure. Their invaluable advice, based on meticulous observation of minute details associated with the daily functioning of our college, enriched us manifold. The consolidated grade

for our college was declared in January 2020. Banwarilal Bhalotia College was re-accredited by the NAAC with grade B+ (CGPA 2.51). We are confident that, armed with necessary insight and experience about the NAAC accreditation process, we shall considerably improve ourselves in the forthcoming cycles of accreditation.

On selection any particular shift, the applicant will find several options:

i) Morning Shift (BA & B.Sc. Programme (General) Course Only).

ii) Day Shift (BA & B.Sc. Honours Course and Electronics & Statistics Programme (General).

ii) Evening Shift (B.Com Honours Course and Programme (General) Courses.

Once the applicant has decided the course that he/she wishes to apply for, he/she must proceed as under:

आज के समय में रोटी, कपड़ा और मकान के साथ-साथ अन्य मौलिक सुविधाओं में शिक्षा भी एक अहम भूमिका निभा रही है। शिक्षा चाहे औपचारिक हो अथवा अनौपचारिक, मानव जीवन के सतत विकास के लिए यह अत्यंत आवश्यक है। यदि शिक्षा का माध्यम मातृभाषा हो शिक्षा तो छात्र न केवल स्वयं के विचारों की सहज रूप में अभिव्यक्त कर सकेंगे वरन् रुचि से शिक्षा के क्षेत्र में विशेष अध्ययन भी कर सकेंगे। मातृभाषा की अनिवार्यता के स्पष्ट करते हुए डॉ. श्यामसुंदर दास ने प्रश्न किया है- "काय संसार में कहीं का भी आप एक दृष्टांत उद्धृत कर सकते हैं जहां बालकों की शिक्षा विदेशी भाषाओं द्वारा होता है।"



पश्चिम बंगाल का शिल्पांचल कुछ वर्ष पूर्व तक इस समस्या से जुझ रहा था। आसानसोल और इसके आसपास के हिंदी भाषी क्षेत्रों में रह रहे लोगों की हार्दिक अभिलाषा थी कि उच्च शिक्षा के लिए हिंदी माध्यम का एक संस्थान उपलब्ध हो ताकि जो छात्र-छात्राएं आर्थिक विपन्नता के कारण बाहर जाकर पढ़ाई नहीं कर पा रहे हैं और विवश होकर पढ़ाई छोड़ने पर मजबूर हैं अथवा हिंदी माध्यम से शिक्षा प्राप्त करने हेतु अन्य राज्यों में पलायन कर रहे हैं, उनका भविष्य खराब न हो। उनके सुखद की व्यवस्था की गयी। माननीय मुख्यमंत्री जी ने इस समस्या से निवारण हेतु सन् २०१५ में बी.बी. कॉलेज हिंदी माध्यम (हिंदी शिफ्ट) की स्थापना की। आज इसका विशाल भवन बनकर तैयार है। जिसका उद्घाटन माननीय शिक्षामंत्री के कर-कमलों द्वारा दिनांक २०.०२.२०१९ को किया गया। भवन के उद्घाटन में पश्चिम बंगाल के श्रम मंत्री श्रीमान मलय घटक, सह० ए० डि० डि० ए० के चेयरमैन श्री तापस बर्नी के साथ-साथ अन्य विशिष्ट अतिथि-गण भी मौजूद थे। वर्तमान में इस शिक्षण संस्था में कला संवर्ग में इतिहास, भूगोल, राजनीति शास्त्र (सम्मान एवं सामान्य) विज्ञान संवर्ग में गणित तथा वनस्पति शास्त्र (सम्मान और सामान्य) तथा वाणिज्य विभाग (सम्मान एवं सामान्य) आदि विषयों का पठन-पाठन एवं परीक्षा की सुविधाएं उपलब्ध है।



सन २०१५ से अब तक २५०० से अधिक छात्रा-छात्राओं ने इसमें प्रवेश लिया है। इसके प्रति अभिभावकों एवं विद्यार्थियों की बढ़ती रुचि और इस संख्या के ध्यान में रखते हुए नये भवन में कमरों की संख्या बढ़ाई गई है। आने वाले समय में महाविद्यालय प्रशासन ने सीटों की संख्या और अधिक बढ़ाने हेतु विश्वविद्यालय की प्रस्ताव भेजा है। भविष्य की परिकल्पना को ध्यान में रखते हुए अध्ययन-अध्यापन के लिए नये अध्यापकों और कार्यालयीन कार्या के लिए गैर-अध्यापन कर्मचारियों की नियुक्ति भी की गई है। पिछले सत्र से महाविद्यालय के परिसर में शैक्षणिक कार्य भी आरंभ हो चुके हैं, जहां छात्रों की प्राथमिक सुविधाओं की ध्यान में रखते हुए बुनियादी आवश्यकताओं जैसे- पानी, बिजली, पंखा, बेच आदि की पूर्णतया व्यवस्था की गई है। सुरक्षा एवं सफाई की भी खास इंतजाम किया गया है, जिसके लिये जल-निकासी एवं चारदिवारी के साथ-साथ पुरा महाविद्यालय परिसर कैमरे के निगरानी में है।



बी.बी. कॉलेज के अंतर्गत यह हिंदी माध्यम संस्था न केवल आस-पास के क्षेत्रों के लिए बल्कि सम्पूर्ण पश्चिम बर्धमान जिले के लिए एक गौरवपूर्ण शिक्षण-संस्थान है। अभिभावकों और छात्रों की रुचि को ध्यान में रखते हुए अन्य विषयों में भी सम्मन एवं सामान्य शिक्षण व्यवस्था उपलब्ध हेतु पुरजोर प्रयास किया जा रहा है।

Netaji Subhas Open University is the premier State Open University in India. The year 1997 was the birth centenary year of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose. The Chief Minister of West Bengal made an announcement at a State function that an Open University would be set up soon in the name of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose. Following this, a State Act (W.B. Act (XIX) of 1997 and recognized by U.G.C.) was passed on 20th August 1997 in favour of opening a University for imparting Distance Education. It is the 14th Open University of the country and the 13th State Open University. The Netaji Subhas Open University started functioning from July 1998 with a Bachelor's Degree Programme (BDP) in Arts & Commerce.

B. B. College study centre of NSOU was running since the inception of this University with arts and commerce subjects only, but in 2014 all science subjects (with honours) was introduced. At present, it has eleven honours subjects (Bengali, English, Pol. Science, History, Accountancy, Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Geography, Zoology and Botany) in three streams. Several post-graduate courses like Bengali, English, Pol. Science, Social work, Public administration, History, Education, Mathematics, Library Science, English Language Teaching and Commerce are also running satisfactorily.

Maulana Azad National Urdu University (MANUU)

Maulana Azad National Urdu University (MANUU) is a Central University, established by an Act of Parliament in 1998 with pan-India jurisdiction. The headquarters and main campus of MANUU is in Gachibowli, Hyderabad. It is spread over 200 acres. MANUU is recognized as a major higher education service provider across the remote areas of the country in Urdu Medium through its regular and distance mode programs. MANUU commenced with distance education programs in 1998 and consolidated its academic and research programs in 2004.

The University has initiated its distance mode programmes from its year of inception. The DDE has set up 9 Regional Centres (Delhi, Patna, Bangalore, Bhopal, Darbhanga, Srinagar, Kolkatta, Mumbai, Ranchi) and 5 Sub-Regional Centres (Hyderabad, Jammu, Amravati, Lucknow, Nuh) across the country so as to provide academic and administrative support to the students.

The B. B. College Distance Education centre of MANUU offers various courses to students, as described below.

DIRECTORATE OF DISTANCE EDUCATION Directorate of Distance Education (DDE) started its functioning from 1998, the year of inception of the university with distance mode BA program. At present, the Directorate offers UGC - Distance Education Bureau (DEB) approved distance mode programs at various levels viz., three PG (MA in Urdu, English and History); four UG programs (BA, BS.c -Life Science, B.Sc. -Physical Science and B.Ed); two Diplomas (Diploma in Journalism and Mass Communication, Diploma in Teach English) and Two certificate programs (Proficiency in English through English and Functional English for Urdu Speakers). The Directorate plans to re-start B.Com. and M.A. (Islamic Studies), and to introduce new programs - MA (Arabic) and MA (Hindi) and few Diploma programs from the academic year 2018. The Directorate has set-up network of nine regional centers (at Bengaluru, Bhopal, Darbhanga, Delhi, Kolkata, Mumbai, Patna, Ranchi, Srinagar) and five Sub-regional centers (at Hyderabad, Lucknow, Jammu, Nuh and Amravati) to provide student support services and management of 158 Learners Support Centers spread across the country. All the programs are of DDE are offered on annual system. The University conducts term end examinations for all above mentioned programs offered by DDE every year. The Degrees, Diploma, Certificates awarded by the University are at par with the certificates of other Central Universities. As on date, there are approximately 40,000 students on DDE's rolls.

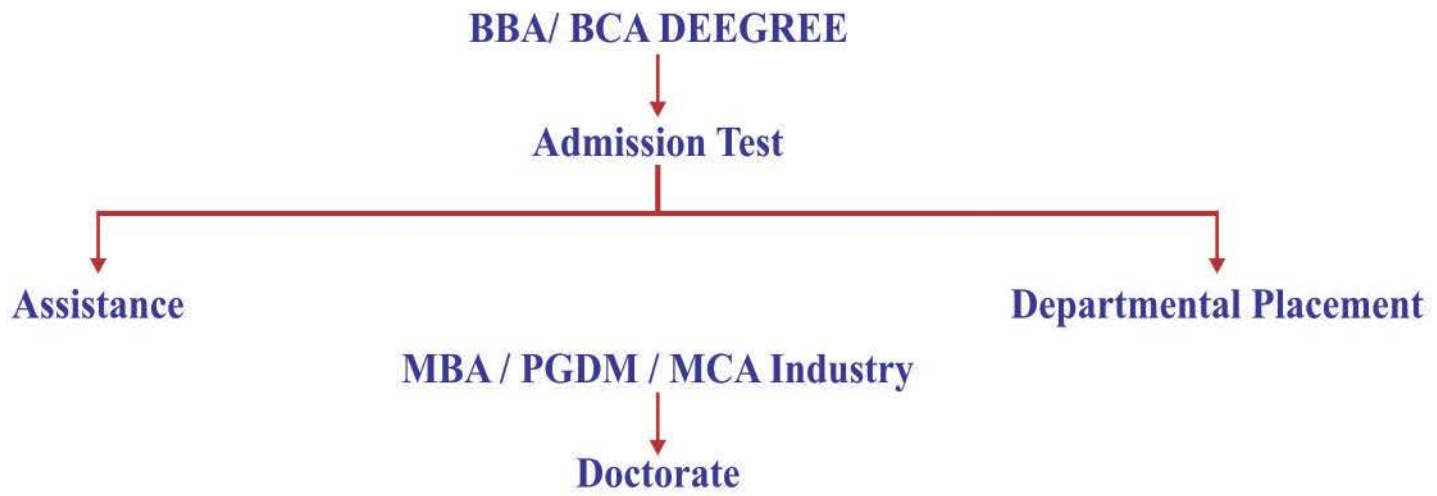

CAREER PROSPECTS AFTER BBA BCA



Infrastructure :

The college is built on a massive space of about 7.80088 acres of land. There are 4 major buildings and 2 administrative centres. Besides, there is a well-stocked Central Library which facilitates the scholastic growth of the pupils. There are, in all, 62 fully functional classrooms in addition to 15 ICT-enabled ones.

Old Heritage Building :

The main building, which houses mostly the science departments, is also the designated Old Heritage Building, constructed in 1971 and inaugurated by Dr. Bidhan Chandra Roy, the then Chief Minister of West Bengal. It has 72 rooms including 37 classrooms and 1 seminar hall-cum-ICT classroom. The centres for distance education and learning like IGNOU and NSOU are also a part of this building.

HUMANITIES AND CENTRAL LIBRARY BUILDING

This building houses all the Arts and Humanities departments. Presently, the Central Library and the Language lab are situated on the first and the second floor, respectively. It also accommodates the Digital Preservation Centre which works towards the digitization of old and rare historical documents. It has 29 rooms including 14 classrooms.

BBA / BCA BUILDING

This building houses departments that run the Professional Courses like BBA and BCA in the college. There are total 12 rooms including 1 computer laboratory. This block also houses another separate library, catering to the specific requirements of students enrolled in the said courses. It further accommodates the NCC wing of the college, the Boys' Common Room and the Students' Union Room.



HINDI SHIFT BUILDING:

The Hindi Shift facilitates scholarly pursuits where Hindi is the medium of instruction. It is housed in a separate building adjacent to the main campus and consists of 5 classrooms and 1 seminar hall.

BOYS' HOSTEL:

The Boys' Hostel is one of the oldest buildings in our College. There are around 32 rooms which house more than 85 students in this hostel.

GIRLS' HOSTEL:

Promila Devi Women's Hostel is another beautiful addition to our infrastructure. There are around 38 rooms in this building. About 90 girls have made our hostel their home away from home.

ADMINISTRATIVE BUILDING:

The old administrative building houses the office of the Head-clerk. It also accommodates the Girls' Common Room.

Our new Administrative Building was inaugurated by Sri Moloy Ghatak, Governing Body President, Banwarilal Bhalotia College, Asansol & Minister-In-Charge, Govt. of West Bengal in 2015. It houses the Principal's Chamber, the IQAC Office and the Accounts Section. Besides, it has a well-equipped, LAN-compatible computer laboratory mainly used for online examinations.

ICT Infrastructure:

The College Management has taken decisive steps to encourage the enhanced use of ICT facilities in all branches of administration as well as academic exchange. This includes the online admission process, and modernization of ICT infrastructure in the administrative offices of the college. We have fourteen classrooms and seminar halls equipped with ICT infrastructure. These rooms have smart boards, projectors, screens and high-end computers to make academic exchange a lively experience. Besides computers installed in each department for daily use, we have a dedicated Central Computing Facility with about 120 computers. This facility has proved to be a great boon for our teachers and students, especially in the conduction of online internal examinations. The college also has a functional Language Laboratory which works towards improving linguistic skills of students, especially enhancing their fluency in the English language. The laboratory is equipped with 9 computer systems and the latest technology software Sanako. Our positive attitude towards modernization of information and communication technology proved to be a great boon for our students and faculty members during the unprecedented lockdown scenario which we faced on account of the outbreak of Covid-19



pandemic. The motivation of our dedicated staff members, coupled with able encouragement of the college administration, ensured that we were able to supply our students with adequate reading material, conduct classes on various online platforms, set and assess assignments, upload pre-recorded lectures, and take recourse to similar other methods to ensure that our students could study from the safety of their homes. A dedicated page was hosted on our college website for this purpose, where our faculty members uploaded reading material for our students. This page also has links to various open-access online educational resources, hosted by reputable national and international institutions, for the benefit of our students. We are proud to add that this endeavour of ours was duly appreciated by not only the student community but also the Higher Education department, Government of West Bengal.

FEE CONCESSION:

The College makes every attempt to ensure that financial problems do not hinder the scholarly growth of the students. It grants fee concession in the form of free studentships (full/half) to the financially disadvantaged students after admission. The aid continues till the completion of his/her course. However, good behaviour, regular attendance and satisfactory progress of the student, are also taken into account. Students who excel in the field of sports are also granted certain monetary exemptions. An application for concession should be made via forms available from the college office as soon as the notice is put up. Even during admission, some of our economically disadvantaged students face difficulties in paying the one-time admission fees. The college has constituted a dedicated College Students' Aid Fund for this purpose, which helps numerous needy students every year. The college further arranges and awards a number of merit scholarships for brilliant students & merit-cum-means scholarship for brilliant and needy students. The college also assists the students in availing government scholarships like the Kanyashree Prakalpa, West Bengal Minority Development Scheme, Post Matric National Scholarship for Minorities, Swami Vivekananda Merit-cum-Means Scholarships etc. Students may contact the respective head clerks in this regard.



STUDENTS' FACILITIES:

B.B. COLLEGE GIRLS' COMMON ROOM

The Girls' Common Room is located on the second storey of the old administrative building. It has an attached wash-room and other necessary amenities for our female students. With an objective to prioritize female health and hygiene, a sanitary napkin vending machine has been installed in the room in collaboration with Lions' Club, Asansol. This properly ventilated, well-lit room provides a quiet haven to its users.

B.B. COLLEGE BOYS' COMMON ROOM

The Boys' Common Room is located to the right of the BBA-BCA building, on the first floor above the Students' Union room. It is an airy, spacious and well-furnished room with drawers for the personal use of students. Facilities for various indoor games like carrom, chess and badminton are also available for the students. It further houses gymnasium accessories like eighteen weight plates, four barbells and two dumbbells sets.

THE COLLEGE PLAYGROUND

Our college has a spacious playground which may be used by students for various outdoor sports. A cricket pitch has been added to the already existing amenities. The ground is regularly maintained to prevent issues like water-logging and weeding. All major activities of the college sports calendar are centred on this beautiful playground, which is daily abuzz with students expressing themselves through various outdoor games.

BADMINTON COURTS AND COLLEGE CANTEEN – NEW ADDITIONS

Recently, two badminton courts have been constructed – one near the Boys' Hostel and one near the Girls' Hostel – for male and female students, respectively. Students enthusiastically take advantage of this facility. Last year, we have also completed the construction of our college canteen. It is now fully functional, providing healthy and nutritious food to students and staff members. The canteen is a great value-addition to the existing facilities in our college, especially for students and staff members who travel a long distance to reach college, and thus require a healthy and filling mid-day meal.



EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

STAFF RECREATION ROOM

The teachers of our college believe that it is not enough to provide encouragement to students through lip-service alone. Our staff enthusiastically participates in games like table tennis and badminton. A dedicated Staff Recreation Room, with a table tennis board, has been set aside for this purpose. It is not uncommon to find our teachers join students on the badminton courts or on the play ground.



STUDENTS' UNION

The Students' Union, the premier student body of the college, is an independent democratically-elected body for effective and quick representation of students' issues and concerns. It works diligently towards establishing an amicable relationship between the college authorities and students, voicing their concerns and facilitating prompt and productive action. The Council comprises the General Secretary, Cultural Assistant Secretary, Assistant General Secretary, Literature & Magazine Assistant Secretary, Boys' Common Room Secretary, Girls' Common Room Secretary, Student Welfare and Social Service secretary. Further, there are class representatives responsible for communicating the grievances of individual departments either directly to the college authorities or through the General Secretary of the Students' Union. They also provide valuable feedback regarding the present curriculum and pedagogical approach followed by respective departments. The Union is further involved in organizing social, cultural, sports and humanitarian events and ensuring the enthusiastic participation of the students. Annual Social Programme – Sanhati

The college celebrates its annual social programme, Sanhati, during spring season where various cultural programmes, ranging from poetry to drama, quiz/debates, inter-departmental stall exhibition competitions are organized. This programme lasts for three days, where we witness active and enthusiastic participation of students, teachers as well as alumni. The presence of celebrities adds charm to the programme.

Blood Donation Camp

Blood Donation Camps are organized every year by the Students' Union of our college. In the past, several units of blood have been collected and deposited at Asansol District Hospital. This year, our institution braved the pandemic to conduct regular blood donation camps and medical camps as part of its social outreach. A community kitchen was also set up by the college and run by the local students for the aid of the downtrodden amidst these dark times. Schemes of social outreach organized by our college get overwhelming response from different strata of the society. Thus, we hope to undertake many such endeavours in the near future.

Sports

Every year the college organizes inter-class football, cricket tournaments as well as different inter-collegiate sports activities on its own playground, which sees the active participation of students and teachers. Meghe Dhaka Tara Cine Club

The college also boasts of a cine club that aims to bring together the admirers of cinema in the city, especially focusing on regional cinema that seems to have been ignored in the wake of mainstream Hindi films. The cine club was announced at a webinar on 15th October 2020. Prof. Sanjay Mukherjee, author, translator, and cultural commentator, former Professor at the Dept. of Film Studies, Jadavpur University and Dr. Parichay Patra, Assistant Professor at the Dept. of Humanities and Social Sciences, IIT Jodhpur were the honourable speakers at the event.

Commemoration of 75 glorious years of our Independence

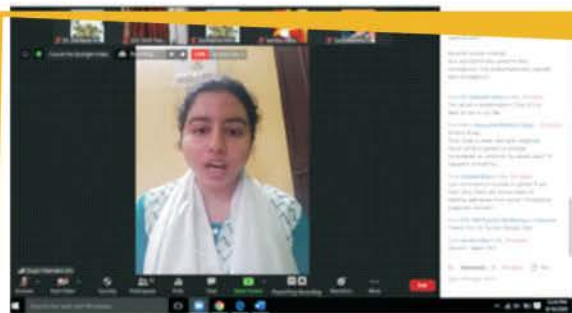

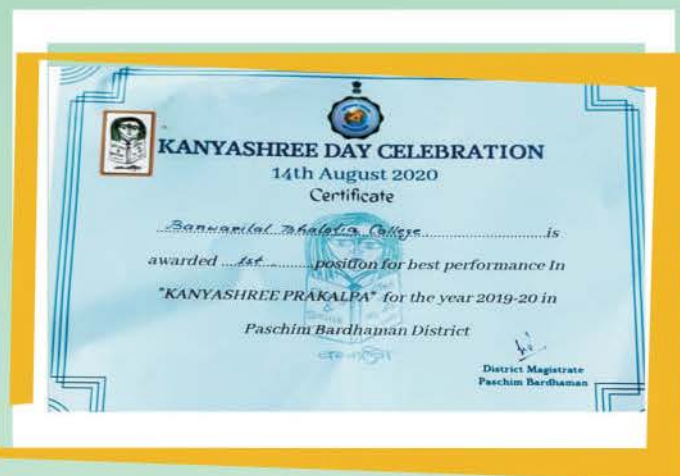


Kanyashree Prakalpa

Putting “Us” ahead of “I”: Our commitment to the welfare of society in the face of the pandemic

The outbreak of the Covid-19 pandemic has taught us in no uncertain terms that our wellbeing is dependent upon the health of the community that we live in. We cannot afford to live smug in isolated happiness. We need to realize that none of us are happy until and unless all of us are happy. We realize with due humility that whatever we do, it will perhaps be inadequate to tackle a calamity of such cosmic proportions. However, we have certainly made an honest effort to come to the aid of our society. The following are some of the ways in which our institution dedicated itself to the service of humanity during, arguably, the greatest crisis faced by our species.

Food distribution drive

The college takes up regular initiatives to aid the residents of its vicinity, especially those of its adopted village at Namo Jamdoba, Kalipahari. This year, the pandemic-induced lockdown has made life far more challenging for the poor villagers at Namo Jamdoba. Under the leadership of our principal Dr. Amitava Basu, some staff members of our institution and representatives from our Students' Union came together to aid the villagers by distributing various food items of daily use among the Adivasi families who reside in the area. In addition, masks were distributed among the villagers and they were made aware of the need to maintain physical distancing, encouraged to use masks in case they step out of their homes, and maintain personal hygiene. The area was also sanitized with due care. In addition, a community kitchen was run for two months by our college teachers and students, in association with a few teachers from neighbouring schools. We may add here, with pride, that our college was among the first educational institutions to take cognizance of the ravaging impact of cyclonic storms like Amphan and Yaas on the Sundarbans and send relief material to the affected families.

Sanitation drive

The Bharat Scouts and Guides wing of B. B. College took up the noble task of sanitizing various public places in order to help combat the pandemic. The activities of the Bharat Scouts and Guides, WB (Paschim Bardhaman District Association) extended to the organization of a district-level workshop on “Free Being Me and Action on Body Confidence” in association with B. B. College on 27th February 2021.

Distribution of Hand Sanitizers and contribution to CM's Relief Fund

During the crisis caused by the first wave of the pandemic, our institution aided the brave frontline workers. Hand sanitizers were prepared in our college laboratory and distributed free of cost among police personnel and health workers. Some sanitizers were also distributed among the poor and downtrodden people. In addition, an amount of Rs. 2,70,000/- was contributed to the Chief Minister's Relief Fund.

In this gloomy atmosphere of uncertainty brought about by the Covid19 pandemic, the Career Counselling and Placement Cell of Banwarilal Bhalotia College provides a ray of hope to students seeking employment and career opportunities after college.



Academic endeavours during the pandemic

The outbreak of the Covid-19 pandemic has reduced the world to relative stasis since last year. Schools, Colleges and Universities were among the worst-affected by the pandemic, and the situation has altered but little since then. The government was compelled to impose shutdowns in all institutions in March 2020. Sensing the situation, B. B. College, Asansol was one of the first colleges in the area that adapted itself to the “new normal”:





- Digital pedagogy and smart management of the Information System is being used extensively to tackle the Covid-19 situation. The single window college website along with the WhatsApp and Telegram groups helped us achieve the difficult goal of reaching out to every student enrolled with our college, even the ones staying at interior locations. In addition, classes were managed using various platforms like Zoom, Skype, UpGrad, Google Meet, etc. Various online resources were provided for remote learning whereby students could correspond with their teachers on digital platforms which were set up online.
- We had instituted a centralised mechanism for online teaching-learning with automatic attendance management and online class assessment and feedback system. Our presence on social media and our extensive use of online tools (Google form, Google Classroom, etc.) ensured that our pedagogical procedures reached all stakeholders. Our robust and steady system of feedback allowed our students to express their specific needs before us. The feedback from our stakeholders is treated with considerable seriousness and empathy for necessary action. Research work, too, is being encouraged and facilitated in spite of the pandemic with the organisation of various national and international webinars on various subjects.
- The admission management for our institution was already being done online. The College Prospectus has been transferred to the e-format to satisfactorily suit the needs of all concerned. The fee waiver schemes to the economically weaker sections have been continued with added vigour on account of the economic devastation caused by the pandemic. The college extended considerable attention to the student community in this regard, with special attention to the students from economically disadvantaged sections of society.
- To avoid overcrowding, examination fee submission and registration to the university were all catered to in the online mode. Also, relevant office management software is being used for smooth operations at the back-end.
- The Central Library was already providing much of its services online. The Online Library has been institutionalised with open access, online material has been expanded manifold and a host of online sources of information has been made available for discourse and studies.
- Official work of the college was resumed as soon as permissible. Activities such as observation of days of national importance, and most other celebrations were continued in online mode. Thus, the institution significantly contributed to the psychological welfare of all its stakeholders.

(CBCS system) Choice Based Credit System

Semester System and Choice Based Credit System

The Indian Higher Education Institutions have been moving from the conventional annual system to semester system.

It has the following basic elements:

-  **Semesters:** The assessment is done semester wise. Two consecutive (one odd (July-December)+ one even (January-June) semesters constitute one academic year.
-  **Credit system:** Each course is assigned a certain credit. Credit is a unit by which the course work is measured.
-  A candidate shall be eligible for appearing at any of the Semesters of U.G. Examination, fulfilling the essential conditions of Minimum 75% attendance of lectures delivered.
-  Pass mark in any course in any semester is 40% of the full marks of the course both for Honours and Program courses. In case of courses having theoretical and practical parts a minimum of 20% is to be scored each in theoretical and practical parts by the candidate.

Types of Courses: for Honours Students:

Courses in a programme may be of three kinds: **1. Core 2. Elective and 3. Foundation.**

1. Core Course :

This is the course which is to be compulsorily studied by a student as a core requirement to complete a programme in a said discipline.

2. Elective Course:

- a) “Generic Elective” (GE): An elective course chosen generally from a discipline other than the main discipline, i.e., interdisciplinary in nature. For ex. A student of Physics Honours has to choose any paper other than Physics like, Math, Chemistry etc.
- b) Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course: which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline.

3. Foundation Course:

The Foundation Courses may be of two kinds: **Compulsory Foundation and Elective foundation.**

Compulsory Foundation or **Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC)** like: Environmental Studies (ENVS), English Communication/MIL (modern Indian language other than English) Communication.

Elective foundationcourse may be termed as Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge.

In Semester II a student may opt for any one language out of English /Bengali/Hindi/Urdu as compulsory Language subject. Students must keep in mind that there is a basic difference between conventional annual system and CBCS that under

CBCS all the papers are taken into consideration at the time calculating their percentage of marks. Even ENVS, ENG/MIL, GE, SEC all papers have equal importance.

The students should study Table-VI, very carefully, the unique features of the CBCS pattern is that the Grade Point in any paper is taken as zero, if the marks is below 40% in any paper. Therefore the credit point (credit*grade point) for that particular paper is also comes to zero. What we have mentioned earlier in this pattern, students have to give equal importance to all papers otherwise their SGPA will get affected.

Code of Conduct for Students:

- Students must wear the photo-identity card provided by the college as long as they are in the college premises.

Certificate Courses

1. Department of Botany, Banwarilal Bhalotia College

A Certificate Course on Mushroom cultivation and Spawn production is being conducted successfully for the last couple of years by the Department of Botany. It was offered in February 2020 just before the Covid19 virus ensnared our country. This year also this course was conducted in the month of February and March (23rd Feb-28th Feb, 8th March and 17th March) when the covid19 virus was almost subdued. But this year it was held in a combination of physical and virtual modes.

2. Department of Commerce (Hindi Shift), Banwarilal Bhalotia College

A Certificate Course on Entrepreneurship development, Business Accounting and Tax Management was successfully conducted by the Department of Commerce (Hindi Shift) from 30th July'2020 – 20th Oct' 2020 (for the session 2020-2021). Out of 30 students who took admission, 28 could finally complete the course and received certificates in the valedictory session held on 23rd November 2020. The course was of 50 hours duration with 30 hours theory and 20 hours of practical with hands-on training. The Course started with the inaugural lecture delivered by Dr. Jahangir Chauhan, Assistant Professor, Department of Commerce, Aligarh Muslim University, via Google Meet. The remaining lectures and practical classes were taken by the departmental faculties.

Banwarilal Bhalotia College provides five well-stocked Central Libraries to support teaching-learning activities effectively. The College Central Library has five sections—Morning, Day, Evening, BBA-BCA and Hindi. The Morning Central Library has a collection of books for General course students; the Day Central Library has the largest collection for Honours and Post Graduate students. The Evening Central Library has a collection of books for Commerce only. The BBA-BCA Central Library has a collection dedicated specifically to BBA-BCA and the Hindi Central Library has a collection for Honours and General Hindi medium students. Besides, there are 19 departmental/ seminar libraries in the concerned departments. Apart from textbooks, the Central Libraries have a huge collection of reference books on each and every subject. Besides catering to the needs of the students, the Central Libraries provide ample opportunities to those who intend to pursue their research in their concerned subjects. The College Central Library was set up since the inception of college i.e. in 1944 and a rich collection of more than 60,000 volumes on different disciplines in the fields of Natural Sciences, Humanities and Social Sciences to equip the students with a wide range of academic resources are available in all five Central Libraries including Departmental Libraries as per records available. The College Central Libraries for Morning, Day and Evening shift are situated in the Humanities building with total area of 3468 sq. ft. with seating capacity for 60 students and 15 academicians. There is a Reading Room attached to the Central Libraries for students. The students are permitted to borrow books or periodicals for Reading Room or for home-loan. The two other Central Libraries are situated in the Hindi shift building and the BBA-BCA building respectively

GLIMPSES OF CENTRAL LIBRARIES:

The College Central Libraries have a good number of Text Books, Reference Books and there are a few rare books also.

Surveillance is carried out through the CCTV in Central Libraries.

Visitors' Register is put for the students in front of circulation window of all Central Libraries.

Users can access the bibliographic record of the Central Libraries through Web OPAC in and outside the library campus.

The photocopy and print facility is available in all the Central Libraries.

The e-books and e-journals are also accessible through INFLIBNET-NLIST on and off-site.

Previous Semester question papers and syllabus of UG and PG are available in the Central Libraries and soft copies of the question papers and syllabus are also available on the College Website

Reference and Referral Service is provided through Email and also from the Central Libraries.

Magazines, Journals and Newspapers are available in the Central Libraries.

Library Webpage of college website is another source of rich and open access e-resources for academic and career oriented development.

Books and journals relating to different competitive examinations are available for consultation in the library.

Outside members i.e. students of IGNOU and NSOU study centres and local people are not allowed to borrow books but they are allowed to access documents within the libraries.

Orientation and awareness program for users are regularly conducted department-wise.

The college also has an efficient Library Advisory Committee constituted by faculties, non-teaching staff and students of our college. All the departments place order for books and journals before the committee. After careful consideration, the Library Advisory Committee allocates budget for them.

RULES & REGULATIONS OF THE COLLEGE LIBRARY

While using the Central Library, users must bring their Library Cards.

The students should remain silent inside the Central Library. Use of mobile phones is strictly prohibited inside the College Library.

Books may be issued from Departmental Libraries also after taking permission from either HOD or In-Charge of the Departmental Libraries.

Students appearing at the University Examinations must return the library books and they should collect a library clearance certificate from the central library before filling out forms for appearing in examinations.

Reference books, costly and rare books are not to be issued from the library without the written permission from competent authority.

Central Library can recall any issued book even before due date. Generally, books must be returned by the students within 15 days from the date of issue. Defaulters have to pay a fine of Re. 1/- per day per book.

Loss of Library cards or books should be immediately reported to the Librarian in writing duly forwarded by the Head of the Institution for information & necessary action. Verbal intimation will not be entertained. For a new Library Card, students have to deposit one passport / stamp size colour photograph and Rs. 25/- for each new Library Card.

Books lost, damaged or defaced must be replaced by the borrower. If the lost book is not available, the borrower will have to pay a fine determined by the appropriate authority.

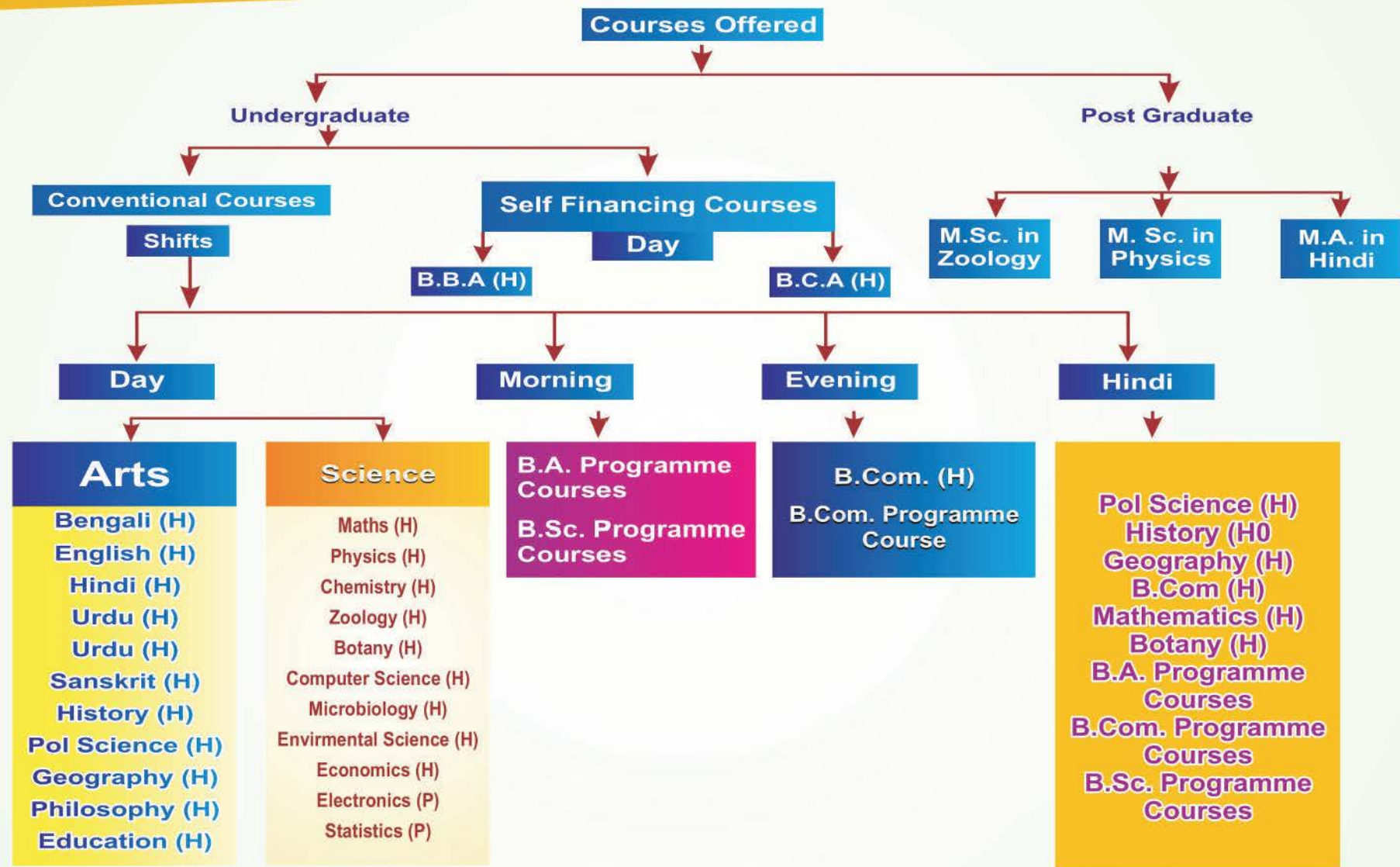

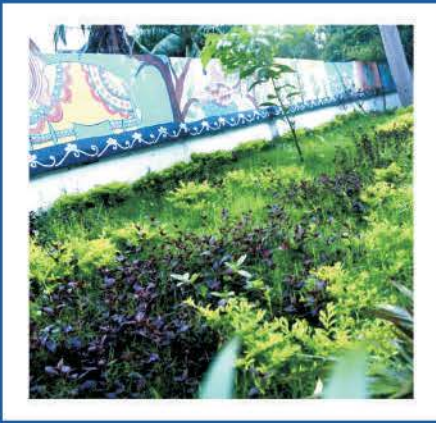
