


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By the early 1940s, Asansol was established as an important industrial belt and thereafter arose the need to boost educational facilities in the area. With such an objective in mind, Prof. Satyakali Mukherjee submitted a proposal to inaugurate a college for the first time in Asansol to the then chairman of Asansol Municipality Mr. Jogendranath Roy and the then S. D. O. Mr. Woodford, I.C.S. This noble endeavor was supported by eminent personalities of the day as well as the general populace, who donated generously for the establishment of a higher educational institution.

Owing to the initiative taken by Mr. G.S. Atwal, a business luminary of the day, the institution came into being on 16th July 1944, with strength of 132 students, enrolled in the I. A. class. Asansol College, as it came to be known, was affiliated to the University of Calcutta. It was originally situated at Atwal Nagar (presently Budha Nagar, Asansol). Later, with a magnanimous donation from Late Banwarilal Bhalotia, the present main building was constructed on an acquired land of 20 bighas. The foundation stone was laid by Dr. Bidhan Chandra Roy. The newly-constructed college building (the present Old Building of the college) was inaugurated by the then Vice Chancellor of Burdwan University, Sri S.K. Guha, and the college was renamed Banwarilal Bhalotia College.

Presently affiliated to Kazi Nazrul University, B. B. College is one of the leading educational institutions in Asansol, providing both general and technology-based education. The college is blessed with a beautiful campus, spacious classrooms, well-equipped laboratories, adequate computer labs, well-stocked libraries and a playground. Besides traditional undergraduate and post-graduate courses in various subjects of Arts, Commerce and Science streams, the college, in tune with the changing needs of higher education, has introduced courses like B.B.A., B.C.A., Environmental Sciences and Water Management, and training courses in dry farming, cultivation of aromatic and medicinal plants, mushroom, lac cultivation, vermicomposting, sericulture and soil water analysis. The college runs three distance education centres of IGNOU, NSOU and MANUU. In 2010, the college was declared as "Centre with Potential for Excellence" by the UGC. In 2011, it received Rs. 50,000 as seed money for the development of Basic Scientific Research (BSR). In 2012, the UGC introduced three career-oriented courses in Functional English, Mobile Repairing and Vermi-composting, which were run successfully by the college for three years. The college has been re-accredited (cycle 2) by the NAAC with grade B+ in 2020. We are confident that, with honest and diligent effort, we will scale greater heights in future.

2018

The construction of Hindi-shift building was completed in all respects (including water connection, electricity, drainage and boundary wall). Classes for the Hindi shift scheduled to start in the forthcoming session in the new building.

A new road was constructed to connect the Hindi-shift building to the college and CCTV was installed for safety and security.

The construction of a garden, along with a fountain, facing the Arts Building has enhanced the beauty of our campus. The college has also undertaken a Mulberry Project in joint collaboration with West Bengal Sericulture Department.

A new concrete road has been completed in place of the kaccha road in college campus, starting from G. T. Road college gate.

A central computer Lab has been constructed inside the college campus. The Lab is utilized for conducting internal assessments online, and for classes whenever necessary.

To create better sports facilities for our students, the college playground was renovated and the drainage system has been improvised so that there is no water logging in the playground.

Paschim Bardhaman District Youth Science fair competition 2018-19 was held on 14th& 15th Sept 2018 in our College and our students from Physics department were awarded first prize.

Student Youth Cultural Programme 2018-19 of Youth and Sports deptt, Govt. of W.B., was successfully organised in our college.

The College completed its 75 years and as a part of Platinum Jubilee Celebration, series of year-long cultural programmes, seminars, quiz and sports competitions were organized, along with a Grand Platinum Jubilee Rally (held on 2nd February, 2019).

New Hindi Shift building was inaugurated by Dr. Partha Chatterjee, Hon'ble Minister, Deptt. of Higher Education, W.B, in presence of Sri Moloy Ghatak, G.B President and Hon'ble Minister Law & Labour & P.H.E. Deptt, Govt. of W.B.

Concretization of roads was completed. Green saplings were planted to further beautify our campus and add to its environment-friendly nature. After a lot of hard work, we have successfully conducted online internal examinations for students all semesters. Another Green Generator of 64.5 KB has been installed in addition to the two existing green generators.

- ☑ To tackle the lockdown induced by the pandemic, a special portal named "Electronic Resources for Remote Learning During COVID-19" has been generated on the home page of the College Website for the easy access of electronic study materials (including PowerPoint presentations, lecture notes, e-books, video lectures etc.) prepared by our faculty members.
- ☑ To enhance the overall academic standard of the College, one International e-Conference and several other Seminars/Webinars/Workshops of State, National and International level have been organized by different Departments, Library and the College under the aegis of IQAC during this pandemic year. Enthusiastic participation of the teachers and the students made all these efforts successful and encouraged us for future endeavours.
- ☑ Central Computer Lab has been remodelled with a complete setup of 100 computers where the students have their computer practical classes. This Central Computing facility has also been utilised for Internal Exam purpose and for different competitive exams as conducted by NTA.
- ☑ New Certificate courses have been started for our students along conventional degree courses to enhance the skill and quality of the education of the students.
- Some major initiatives have been taken to make the College Campus more eco-friendly (like plantation of trees throughout the year, creating a paperless administrative system & paperless Internal Exam system, installation of rainwater harvesting system, reduction of power consumption, proper waste management, Green Audit etc.). A Nature Club named "Beagle" was formed to enhance awareness and involvement among all the students and staff for a drive towards a more eco-friendly sustainable College Campus along with its surroundings.

- ☑ Our entire college campus has been lighted with modern, energy-efficient LED lights, granted by the ADDA authority. This has not only further secured our campus, but also added to its radiant splendour, especially during the evenings.

After a lockdown of almost two years, B. B. College, like other educational institutions in the state, restarted classes in the usual physical mode. The institution, and all its stakeholders, deserve credit for being able to strictly follow all Covid protocols as notified by the government from time to time. We have been able to return to usual methods of academic, co-curricular and extra-curricular engagements with our students, without jeopardizing the health concerns of our stakeholders.

- ☑ New paver block road has been constructed in front of the administrative building, to the backside of the canteen.

- ☑ Central Computer Lab facilities have been further extended with 30 upgraded computers.
- ☑ Number of CCTVs has increased to enhance the surveillance and safety on our campus.
- ☑ Classrooms of the all the buildings/blocks have been coloured from inside to enhance its beauty and cleanliness.
- ☑ Two more water cooler-cum-purifiers have been installed to provide quality drinking water to the students.
- ☑ Security measures have been extended by increasing the number of fire extinguishers by purchasing new ones and refilling old ones.
- ☑ The old lights have been replaced by new LED lights and old ceiling fans have been replaced with energy-efficient models to enhance infrastructure and reduce electricity consumption.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS:



Students must wear the photo-identity card provided by the college as long as they are in the college premises.



Loitering in the corridors, near classrooms, examination halls, offices or any other place in the college where such activities might cause disturbance, is strictly prohibited.



Smoking or consuming any sort of intoxicant inside the college premises is strictly prohibited.



At least 75% of classes must be attended, failing which a student will not be allowed to write examinations under the CBCS. In case a student does not maintain the said attendance percentage due to medical or any other valid reason, he/she must appeal for exemption in writing, providing adequate evidence.



Students must pay due respect to their teachers, non-teaching staff, and seniors in college. They are expected to maintain cordial relation among themselves.



During examinations or class tests, the sanctity of the procedure must be maintained. Any misdemeanour, including cheating, will be considered as serious offence.



Illegal activities of any kind, in contravention of law, are strictly prohibited.

Libraries - Our Great Assets

The Banwarilal Bhalotia College Central Library serves as the hub of a wheel whose spokes connect to all departments of the college. The Central Library, consisting of the morning, day, and evening shifts of the college, and the libraries of the BBA-BCA and Hindi sections of the college, are all well stocked and actively support the teaching-learning initiatives of the institution. The morning shift of the Central Library has the collection for general course students; the day shift of the Central Library has developed the largest collection for honours and postgraduate students for the college in tune with the responsibility resting upon it. The evening shift of the Central Library, similar to the evening shift of the College, develops the collection for the entire range of the discipline of commerce. The library of BBA-BCA caters to the students in the BBA-BCA section, and the library of Hindi Shift consists of the collections for honours and general Hindi medium students. Besides, there are 19 departmental or seminar libraries in the concerned department. Apart from the textbooks, the Central Library has a huge collection of reference books on each and every subject. Besides catering to the needs of the students and staff, the Central Library provides ample opportunities to those who intend to pursue their research in their concerned subjects. The College Central Library was set up at the inception of the college, i.e., 1944, and a rich collection of more than 61,000 copies on different disciplines in the fields of natural science, humanities, and social sciences equips the students with a wide range of academic resources available in all sections of the Central Library and other libraries, including departmental libraries, as per records available. The College Central Library, with morning, day, and evening shifts, is situated in the Humanities Building, with a total area of 3468 sq. ft. and a seating capacity of 60 students and 15 academicians. There is a reading room attached to the central library for students. The students are permitted to issue books or periodicals for the reading room or for home loans. The two other libraries are situated in the Hindi Shift Building and the BBA-BCA Building. The seminar libraries are located in the respective departments.

A glance at our Central Library:

- The Central Library has a good number of text books and reference books, and there are a few rare books as well.
- Surveillance is made possible through CCTV in Central Library.
- Users can access the bibliographic record of the Central Library through WebOPAC, both inside and outside the library campus.
- The Central Library now boasts automated, entirely online book issue and lending services, which progressively cuts down on waiting time, keeps records digitally, and improves service by offering users a platform to check their personalised library profiles online.

- The "Electronic Resources for Remote Learning During COVID-19" is an exemplary online library openly accessible from the college website (in the upper right-hand corner of the web page) and curated painstakingly by the Website Monitoring Committee during COVID, which continues to be beneficial for all stakeholders. This online library is a site for openly accessible resources from the world wide web and also a repository of study materials created by the faculties of the college as per the university syllabi.
- The emerging archival section of the Central Library presently operates from a separate room adjacent to the library. It employs various software and hardware tools for the digitization of previous question papers, rare and valuable books, and other legacy documents not only of the college but also of the community. This section has the potential to become a knowledge site for discussing and debating digital scholarship and to surface as a repository of the memories of the city.
- Photocopy and printout facilities are available in all the Central Libraries.
- The e-books and e-journals are also accessible through INFLIBNET and NLIST, both on and off-site.
- Previous semester question papers and syllabi for UG and PG are available in the Central Library, and soft copies of the question papers and syllabi are also uploaded and made available on the College Website.
- Reference and Referral services are to be provided via email, WhatsApp, and also from the Central Library.
- Magazines, journals, and newspapers are available in the Central Library.
- The Library Webpage of the college website is another source of rich and open-access e-resources for academic and career-oriented development.
- Books and journals relating to different competitive examinations are available for consultation in the library.
- Outside members such as alumni of the college, students of IGNOU, NSOU and MANUU study centres, and local people are provided partial access to our Central Library, i.e., they are not allowed to borrow books but they are allowed to access documents within the library.
- Orientation and awareness programs for users are usually conducted departmentally.
- The college also has an efficient Library Advisory Committee comprised of faculty, non-teaching staff, and students of our college. All the departments place orders for books and journals before the committee. After careful consideration, the Library Advisory Committee allocates a budget for necessary purchase or upgradation of resources.

RULES & REGULATIONS OF THE COLLEGE LIBRARY

- While using the Central Library, users must bring their Library Cards.
- The students should remain silent inside the Central Library. Use of mobile phones is strictly prohibited inside the College Library.
- Books may be issued from Departmental Libraries also after taking permission from either HOD or In-Charge of the Departmental Libraries.
- Students appearing at the University Examinations must return the library books and they should collect a library clearance certificate from the central library before filling up form for appearing examination.



Central Library can recall any issued book even before due date. Generally, books must be returned by the students within 15 days from the date of issue. Defaulters have to pay a fine of Rs. 1 per day per book.

Books lost, damaged or defaced must be replaced by the borrower. If the lost book is not available, the borrower will have to pay a fine determined by the appropriate authority.


Extension of the Library and its Relocation to a New Home: Our Dream

- The development of a new two-storey library on top of the administrative building is currently in full swing.
- Along with the existing academic library, this new library will feature a gallery, an archive, and a museum. It will showcase the heritage of the city and the institution through GLAM (Gallery, Library, Archive, Museum).
- The extra space in the new building will allow us to plan out all of the library's operations in a more creative and elaborate manner.
- In order to strengthen the central library's open access policy, the new library building will include reading space for students within the library stack hall room. There will be space for reading and researching for the faculties, and a modest multipurpose space for meetings, seminars, and content development.
- There will be a makers' space for the library, in addition to more traditional facilities including a technical section for processing new library collections, a digital access section, and a periodicals section. The goal is to create a platform where cultural content and artefacts can be co-created.
- During the day, the interior design will maximise the usage of sunlight and air. A number of ergonomic pieces of furniture will be purchased. The new green library is intended to be accommodating to users with disabilities.
- Outside the main gate, there will be a ramp, and the library, which will be situated on the third and fourth floors of the current administrative building, will have a lift. Inside the library, visual signals, guides, and maps will be installed to assist everyone, including those with visual impairments, in navigating the aisles.


CENTRAL INSTRUMENTATION (RESEARCH) FACILITY

The College provides state-of-the-art research facility on campus, designated as Central Research Facility. It includes instruments like, autoclave, laminar air-flow, temperature-controlledincubator with shaker, hot-air oven, photo periodic seed germinator, UV-VIS spectrophotometer, PCR machine (thermocycler), Gel electrophoresis apparatus (vertical and slab gel), centrifuge (both high and low speed) etc. Both UG and PG level students undertake their projects in the Central Research Facility under the guidance of learned faculty. The Central facility also undertakes projects from other Colleges and Universities

INFRASTRUCTURE

The college is built on a massive space of about 7.80088 acres of land. There are 4 major buildings and 2 administrative centres. Besides, there is awell-stocked Central Librarywhich facilitates the scholastic growth of the pupils. There are, in all, 62 fully functional classrooms in addition to 15ICT-enabled ones. The playground inside the college campus is one of the components of the holistic development of the students. Recently, the ground has been made more attractive by concrete fencing around it and the construction of an entrance gate. There is also a canteen within the college campus for refreshment of the students. At present, a project has been planned to build a state-of-the-art auditorium to organize various programmes and seminars etc. of the college. Giving importance to the needs of the society and the environment, the college has recently taken an initiative to install solar panels to reduce the use of conventional energy to a large extent, which will be completed very soon. Inside the college, there are statues of luminaries like Swami Vivekananda, Rabindranath Tagore, Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose and Iswarchandra Vidyasagar which inspire students and staff.

OLD HERITAGE BUILDING:

The main building, which houses mostly the science departments, is also the designated Old Heritage Building, constructed in 1971 and inaugurated by Dr. Bidhan Chandra Roy, the then Chief Minister of West Bengal. It has 72 rooms including 37 classrooms and 1 seminar hall-cum-ICT classroom. The centres for distance education and learning likeIGNOUandNSOUare also a part of this building.



HUMANITIES AND CENTRAL LIBRARY BUILDING

This building houses all the Arts and Humanities departments. Presently, the Central Library and the Language lab are situated on the first and the second floor, respectively. It also accommodates the Digital Preservation Centre which works towards the digitization of old and rare historical documents. It has 29 rooms including 14 classrooms. A beautiful flower garden adjacent to this building captures everyone's mind and sight. A butterfly garden is being constructed with the financial support of Department of Environment, Government of West Bengal, which will make the college environmenteco-friendlier and more attractive.



BBA / BCA Building:

This building houses departments that run the Professional Courses like BBA and BCA in the college. There are total 12 rooms including 1 computer laboratory. This block also houses another separate library, catering to the specific requirements of students enrolled in the said courses. It further accommodates the NCC wing of the college, the Boys'CommonRoomandthe Students' UnionRoom.



HINDI SHIFT BUILDING:

The Hindi Shift facilitates scholarly pursuits where Hindi is the medium of instruction. It is housed in a separate building adjacent to the main campus and consists of 5 classrooms and 1 seminar hall. In a bid to cater to the needs of ever-increasing number of students in our Hindi Shift, the college has enhanced the infrastructure by adding 4 large rooms on the second floor of the Hindi Shift building. Recently, an approach road of paver block has been constructed through the adjacent garden of this building and many trees have been planted and beautification initiatives have been taken to make the garden attractive.



BOYS' HOSTEL:

The Boys' Hostel is one of the oldest buildings in our College. There are around 32 rooms which house more than 85 students in this hostel.



GIRLS' HOSTEL:

Promila Devi Women's Hostel is another beautiful addition to our infrastructure. There are around 38 rooms in this building. About 90 girls have made our hostel their home away fromhome.



ADMINISTRATIVE BUILDING:

The old administrative building houses the office of the Head-clerk. It alsoaccommodates the Girls'CommonRoom. Our new Administrative Building was inaugurated by Sri Moloy Ghatak, Governing Body President, Banwarilal Bhalotia College, Asansol&Minister-In-Charge, Govt. of West Bengal in 2015. It houses the Principal's Chamber, the IQAC Office and the Accounts Section.

Besides, it has a well-equipped, LAN-compatible computer laboratory mainly used for online examinations. We have recently undertaken an extension of this section, and plan to shift our library here. Also, we have several plans for the extension and advancement of library facilities, once the section is shifted to itsnewhome. This work is almost complete. With its inauguration, soonthe door of this state-of-the-art knowledge repository will be opened to the students.

LABORATORIES:

The College has 21 spacious andwell-equipped laboratories attached to various departments likeChemistry, Physics, Botany, Zoology and Microbiology, Electronics, Environmental Science and Geography. The laboratories are equipped with modern instruments to cater to the needs of the present syllabus and beyond. The Physics and Zoology departments have spacious post-graduate laboratories as well. The college has well-equipped Computer Laboratories including one well-equipped central Computer laboratory with peer-to-peer network and internet for the use of students tomeetall necessary curriculum requirements. During the post Covid period, some modern laboratory equipments have been added to the laboratories which will make the teaching learning environment more realistic and enriching.

ICT INFRASTRUCTURE:

The College Management has taken decisive steps to encourage the enhanced use of ICT facilities in all branches of administration as well as academic exchange. This includes the online admission process, and modernization of ICT infrastructure in the administrative offices of the college. We have fourteen classrooms and seminar halls equipped with ICT infrastructure. These rooms have smart boards, projectors, screens and high-end computers to make academic exchange a lively experience. Besides computers installed in each department for daily use, we have a dedicated Central Computing Facility with about 120 computers. This facility has proved to be a great boon for our teachers and students, especially in the conduction of online internal examinations. The college also has a functional Language Laboratory which works towards improving linguistic skills of students, especially enhancing their fluency in the English language. The laboratory is equipped with 9 computer systems and the latest technology software Sanako. Our positive attitude towards modernization of information and communication technology proved to be a great boon for our students and faculty members during the unprecedented lockdown scenario which we faced on account of the outbreak of Covid-19 pandemic. The motivation of our dedicated staff members, coupled with able encouragement of the college administration, ensured that we were able to supply our students with adequate reading material, conduct classes on various online platforms, set and assess assignments, upload pre-recorded lectures, and take recourse to similar other methods to ensure that our students could study from the safety of their homes. A dedicated page was hosted on our college website for this purpose, where our faculty members uploaded reading material for our students. This page also has links to various open-access online educational resources, hosted by reputable national and international institutions, for the benefit of our students. We are proud to add that this endeavour of ours was duly appreciated by not only the Student community but also the Higher Education department, Government of West Bengal.

We have further enhanced our ICT infrastructure by launching an app on Playstore – BB College e-Connect – which will be of great help both for our students as well as staff members. Through the app, various data concerning daily academic and administrative activities in college may be accessed convenientlyby all concerned stakeholders.

Fees Slip: Using this tab student can see their payment slip, like: Semester I –II, Semester III-IV & Semester V-VI. When student successfully complete their payment then the payment slips are visible in the Fees Slip section.

Fees Payment : Using this tab student can pay their fees. But this system access is given by admin from Fees Software. Otherwise `No Data Available`messageis visible in this tab.

Exam Result: Under his tab student exam result are visible when students take their exam. Otherwise `No Data Available` is visible in this tab.

Exam Answer: Here, students' exam answers are visible when student take their exam. Otherwise `No Data Available`is visible in this tab.

Attendance: In this tab student can check their attendance details. First student must select month and year and then click the search button but there is a condition: if the student is present in that particular year then the particular year is visible under the year option.

Notice: In this section, college notices are visible which are also uploaded on the website using website admin panel.

Special Notice: In this section, special notices are visible which are uploaded by the teacher himself/herself using their login panel.

Holidays: In this section all holidays are visible, which are uploaded by the college using the fees software. In the `Student zone` menu, on the fees panel there is a sub menu named Create Holidays`. Using this sub menu the admin can upload list of holidays by clicking' Add New'option.

Events: In this section, all events are visible, which are uploaded by the college on the fees software. In the `Student zone` menu on the fees panel there is a sub menu named Create Events. Using this sub menu the admin can upload events by clicking 'add new' option.

Library Details: In this Section Library Book details are visible. Issued books and books which have been returned by the students are visible in this section. But if the student cannot take any book from the library, then 'data not available' message is shown

Student Zone: Student Zone status is dependent on students' attendance details and students' exam marks. If these two data are available for a particular student in the current session, then the said status is visible otherwise the system shows nothing.

Netaji Subhas Open University is the premier State Open University in India. The year 1997 was the birth centenary year of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose. The Chief Minister of West Bengal made an announcement at a State function that an Open University would be set up soon in the name of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose. Following this, a State Act (W.B. Act (XIX) of 1997 and recognized by U.G.C.) was passed on 20th August 1997 in favour of opening a University for imparting Distance Education. It is the 14th Open University of the country and the 13th State Open University. The Netaji Subhas Open University started functioning from July 1998 with a Bachelor's Degree Programme (BDP) in Arts & Commerce.

B. B. College study centre of NSOU has been running since the inception of this University with arts and commerce subjects only, but in 2014 all science subjects (with Honours) were introduced. At present, it has eleven honours subjects (Bengali, English, Education, Pol. Science, History, Accountancy, Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Geography, Zoology and Botany) in three streams. Several post-graduate courses like Bengali, English, Pol. Science, Social work, Public administration, History, Education, Mathematics, Library Science, English Language Teaching and Commerce are also running satisfactorily. The University has implemented New Choice based credit System (CBCS) pattern for under graduate programmes from the academic year 2021-2022.

Several PG Course are also running smoothly in this LSC. Most of the counseling sessions for PG course is conducted in the Regional Centre, Netaji Subhas Open University, Durgapur. Maulana Azad National Urdu University (MANUU) is a Central University, established by an Act of Parliament in 1998 with pan-India jurisdiction. The headquarters and main campus of MANUU is in Gachibowli, Hyderabad. It is spread over 200 acres. MANUU is recognized as a major higher education service provider across the remote areas of the country in Urdu Medium through its regular and distance mode programs. MANUU commenced with distance education programs in 1998 and consolidated its academic and research programs in 2004.

The University has initiated its distance mode programmes from its year of inception. The DDE has set up 9 Regional Centres (Delhi, Patna, Bangalore, Bhopal, Darbhanga, Srinagar, Kolkatta, Mumbai, Ranchi) and 5 Sub-Regional Centres (Hyderabad, Jammu, Amravati, Lucknow, Nuh) across the country so as to provide academic and administrative support to the students.

The B. B. College Distance Education centre of MANUU offers various courses to students, as described below.

DIRECTORATE OF DISTANCE EDUCATION Directorate of Distance Education (DDE) started its functioning from 1998, the year of inception of the university with distance mode BA program. At present, the Directorate offers UGC - Distance Education Bureau (DEB) approved distance mode programs at various levels viz., three PG (MA in Urdu, English and History); four UG programs (BA, BS.c -Life Science, B.Sc. -Physical Science and B.Ed); two Diplomas (Diploma in Journalism and Mass Communication, Diploma in Teach English) and Two certificate programs (Proficiency in English through English and Functional English for Urdu Speakers). The Directorate plans to re-start B.Com. and M.A. (Islamic Studies), and to introduce new programs - MA (Arabic) and MA (Hindi) and few Diploma programs from the academic year 2018. The Directorate has set-up network of nine regional centers (at Bengaluru, Bhopal, Darbhanga, Delhi, Kolkata, Mumbai, Patna, Ranchi, Srinagar) and five Sub-regional centers (at Hyderabad, Lucknow, Jammu, Nuh and Amravati) to provide student support services and management of 158 Learners Support Centers spread across the country. All the programs are of DDE are offered on annual system. The University conducts term end examinations for all above mentioned programs offered by DDE every year. The Degrees, Diploma, Certificates awarded by the University are at par with the certificates of other Central Universities. As on date, there are approximately 40,000 students on DDE's rolls.
