

## Organogram of B.B. College, Asansol



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By the early 1940s, Asansol was established as an important industrial belt and thereafter arose the need to boost educational facilities in the area. With such an objective in mind, Prof. Satyakali Mukherjee submitted a proposal to inaugurate a college for the first time in Asansol to the then chairman of Asansol Municipality Mr. Jogendranath Roy and the then S. D. O. Mr. Woodford, I.C.S. This noble endeavor was supported by eminent personalities of the day as well as the general populace, who donated generously for the establishment of a higher educational institution.

Owing to the initiative taken by Mr. G.S. Atwal, a business luminary of the day, the institution came into being on 16<sup>th</sup> July 1944, with strength of 132 students, enrolled in the I. A. class. Asansol College, as it came to be known, was affiliated to the University of Calcutta. It was originally situated at Atwal Nagar (presently Budha Nagar, Asansol). Later, with a magnanimous donation from Late Banwarilal Bhalotia, the present main building was constructed on an acquired land of 20 big has. The foundation stone was laid by Dr. Bidhan Chandra Roy. The newly-constructed college building (the present Old Building of the college) was inaugurated by the then Vice Chancellor of Burdwan University, Sri S.K. Guha, and the college was renamed Banwarilal Bhalotia College.

Presently affiliated to Kazi Nazrul University, B. B. College is one of the leading educational institutions in Asansol, providing both general and technology-based education. The college is blessed with a beautiful campus, spacious classrooms, well-equipped laboratories, adequate computer labs, well-stocked libraries and a playground. Besides traditional undergraduate and post-graduate courses in various subjects of Arts, Commerce and Science streams, the college, in tune with the changing needs of higher education, has introduced courses like B.B.A., B.C.A., Environmental Sciences and Water Management, and training courses in dry farming, cultivation of aromatic and medicinal plants, mushroom, lac cultivation, vermi-composting, sericulture and soil water analysis. The college runs three distance education centres of IGNOU, NSOU and MANUU. In 2010, the college was declared as "Centre with Potential for Excellence" by the UGC.

In 2011, it received Rs. 50,000 as seed money for the development of Basic Scientific Research (BSR). B. B. College is committed to provide value-based education to the highest possible number of candidates. However, like in the case of any other higher educational institution, we are constrained by rules and regulations set forth by the UGC and our affiliating university. Thus, many interested candidates are not able to enroll themselves to our full-time courses. Various academic, social and financial challenges often keep large sections of our society beyond the purview of conventional modes of education. In order to cater to such pressing needs, the College runs three Distance Education Centres to provide quality education, with proper recognition and affiliation, to a large number of people. ### 2018

The construction of a garden, along with a fountain, facing the Arts Building has enhanced the beauty of our campus. The college has also undertaken a Mulberry Project in joint collaboration with West Bengal Sericulture Department.

A new concrete road has been completed in place of the kaccha road in college campus, starting from G.T. Road college gate.

A central computer Lab has been constructed inside the college campus. The Lab is utilized for conducting internal assessments online, and for classes whenever necessary. To create better sports facilities for our students, the college playground was renovated and the drainage system has been improvised so that there is no water logging in the playground.

Paschim Bardhaman District Youth Science fair competition 2018-19 was held on 14<sup>th</sup> & 15<sup>th</sup> Sept 2018 in our College and our students from Physics department were awarded first prize. Student Youth Cultural Programme 2018-19 of Youth and Sports deptt, Govt. of W.B., was successfully organised in our college.

### 2019-2020

The highlight of the year 2019 was the much-needed completion of the NAAC accreditation process (cycle 2) of our college. Banwarilal Bhalotia College was re-accredited by the NAAC with grade B+ (CGPA 2.51). We are confident that, armed with necessary insight and experience about the NAAC accreditation process, we shall considerably improve ourselves in the forthcoming cycles of accreditation.

The College completed its 75 years and as a part of Platinum Jubilee Celebration, series of year-long cultural programmes, seminars, quiz and sports competitions were organized, along with a Grand Platinum Jubilee Rally (held on 2<sup>nd</sup> February, 2019).

New Hindi Shift building was inaugurated by Dr. Partha Chatterjee, Hon'ble Minister, Deptt. of Higher Education, W.B, in presence of Sri Moloy Ghatak, G.B President and Hon'ble Minister Law & Labour & P.H.E. Deptt, Govt. of W.B.

Concretization of roads was completed. Green saplings were planted to further beautify our campus and add to its environment-friendly nature. After a lot of hard work, we have successfully conducted online internal examinations for students all semesters. Another Green Generator of 64.5 KB has been installed in addition to the two existing green generators.

### 2020-2021

To tackle the lockdown induced by the pandemic, a special portal named "Electronic Resources for Remote Learning During COVID-19" has been generated on the home page of the College Website for the easy access of electronic study materials (including PowerPoint presentations, lecture notes, e-books, video lectures etc.) prepared by our faculty members. Though the worst of the pandemic is behind us, these resources continue to admirably aid our students.

Central Computer Lab has been remodelled with a complete setup of 100 computers where the students sit for their computer practical classes. This Central Computing facility is also utilised for Internal Exams and different competitive exams as conducted by NTA.

### 2020-2021

New Certificate courses have been started for our students (in addition to conventional degree courses) to enhance the skill of students.

Some major initiatives have been taken to make the College Campus eco-friendly (like plantation of trees throughout the year, creating a paperless administrative system & paperless Internal Exam system, installation of rainwater harvesting system, reduction of power consumption, proper waste management, Green Audit etc.). A Nature Club named "Beagle" was formed to enhance awareness and involvement among all the students and staff for a drive towards a more eco-friendly sustainable College Campus along with its surroundings.

After a lockdown of almost two years, B. B. College, like other educational institutions in the state, restarted classes in the usual physical mode in November 2021. The institution, and all its stakeholders, deserve credit for being able to strictly follow all Covid protocols as notified by the government from time to time.

### 2021-2022

To realize a long-standing dream of all stakeholders of our institution, we have initiated plans to build a state-of-the-art building in our college premises, adjacent to the G. T. Road gate. The construction of the auditorium will begin soon.

Keeping in mind the current job scenario as well as recent NAAC directives concerning social inclusiveness, our Entrepreneurship Development Cell (EDC) has taken definite steps. Our institution, with the help of MSME, Govt. of WB, has signed an MoU with The Global Link Initiative (based in the USA) to extend ICT support, technical support, economic viability, etc. to young entrepreneurs. Such initiatives will aid not only our students, but the community at large.

We have substantially increased the area coverage of our CC cameras to further enhance safety and security on our campus.

Keeping in mind the needs of visually-impaired persons on campus, specially-designed boards will be installed at various offices and other prominent locations in our college.

The highlight of the previous academic session was the inauguration of our new Central Library. The two-storey library, housed in the administrative building, welcomes readers of diverse interests. This isn't just a library; it's a vibrant hub of knowledge and creativity, a testament to the college's commitment to intellectual growth. ### 2023-2024

The highlight of the previous academic session was the inauguration of our new Central Library. The two-storey library, housed in the administrative building, welcomes readers of diverse interests. This isn't just a library; it's a vibrant hub of knowledge and creativity, a testament to the college's commitment to intellectual growth. Recently, the college playground has been made more attractive by concrete fencing around this ground and the construction of an entrance.

Heeding to the needs of the society and the environment, the college has installed solar panels and this initiative has reduced the use of conventional energy to a large extent. This step reaffirms our commitment to bringing in a meaningful change in the wake of the threat of global warming and destruction of the environment.

In a bid to cater to the needs of ever-increasing number of students in our Hindi Shift, the college has enhanced the infrastructure by adding 4 large rooms on the second floor of the Hindi Shift building.

### 2024-2025

The last academic session, too, was marked by a flurry of upgradation procedures, both in terms of physical infrastructure as well as intellectual infrastructure. The long-cherished dream of a college auditorium is now under active construction and is expected to be completed within the next two to three years, becoming a landmark facility for the institution.

In alignment with the Government of India's educational reforms, the college is set to benefit from the One Nation One Subscription (ONOS) initiative, a Central Sector Scheme under the Ministry of Education (MoE), which has been implemented from January 2025. This initiative grants unified access to over 13,000 journals from 30 reputed publishers, significantly boosting academic and research capabilities across various disciplines.

Recently, an approach road of pavers block has been constructed through the adjacent garden for ease of access to our Hindi Shift building.

A dedicated space for Career Counselling Cell is being established to assist students with career planning and preparation for competitive examinations, with regular campus interviews and industry interaction programs aimed at enhancing employability and offering valuable placement opportunities.

## CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS:

## CENTRAL RESEARCH FACILITY IN SCIENCE

The College provides state-of-the-art research facility on campus , designated as Central Research Facility. It includes instruments like, autoclave, laminar air-flow, temperature-controlled incubator with shakers, hot-air oven, photo periodic seed germinator, UV-VIS spectrophotometer, PCR machine (thermocycler), Gel electrophoresis apparatus (vertical and slab gel), centrifuge (both high and low speed) etc. Both UG and PG level students undertake their projects in the central research facility under the guidance of learned faculty. The Central facility also undertakes projects from other Colleges and Universities.




## THE SCOUTS & GUIDE

13. Celebration of National Yoga Day.







#### 1. International Seminar:-

The Department of Botany, Banwarilal Bhalotia College, Asansol, organized a prestigious International Seminar titled "Biology at Crossroads: Recent Advancements" on 3rd April 2025, under the aegis of the R&D Cell and IQAC of the institution. The seminar featured lectures from four eminent speakers of national and international repute. Notably, a pre-lecture session was organized on 17th March 2025, delivered online by Dr. Debasish Paul, a research scientist at the National Institutes of Health (NIH), USA. ## 2. Workshop on Natural Farming :

The workshop was held on 4<sup>th</sup> March, 2025. Natural cultivation is a farming method that uses ecological processes to grow crops, trees, and livestock without chemicals. It's also known as "The Fukuoka Method" or "Do-Nothing Farming"

The Union Cabinet chaired by Prime Minister approved the launching of the National Mission on Natural Farming (NMNF) as a standalone Centrally Sponsored Scheme under the Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers' Welfare. The Government of India has launched the National Mission on Natural Farming (NMNF) to promote natural farming in mission mode across the country as a unique Centrally Sponsored Scheme under the Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers' Welfare. NMNF aims at promoting NF

practices for providing safe & nutritious food for all. The Mission is designed to support farmers to reduce input cost of cultivation and dependency to externally purchased inputs.

Keeping mind the above fact we have conducted a workshop on it. The participants are heterogeneous and include students, staff of all category and also some local marginal farmed attached with vegetable grower. All total 41 candidates have participated in this programme (13 framer, 8 teachers, 4 laboratory staff and 16 farmers).

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## DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

## OTHER RELEVANT INFORMATION ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT

The Department of Zoology is deeply committed to fostering academic excellence, scientific inquiry, and social responsibility. A wide array of dynamic programs and activities are regularly organized to enhance scholarly engagement, promote environmental awareness, and serve the community. These initiatives aim to broaden the intellectual horizons of students while also contributing meaningfully to society.

### 1. National and International Seminars

The international conference titled "Zooverse" was organized on 22<sup>nd</sup> November 2024, with the central theme "Defining and Redefining Diseases and Its Impact on Society." The keynote address was delivered by Prof. Gautam Chandra, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor of The University of Burdwan, who highlighted the importance of interdisciplinary research in understanding disease dynamics in a rapidly changing world. The seminar featured eminent speakers including Dr. Ranjit Kumar Ghosh, Dr. Sourav Banerjee, Dr. Satarupa Ganguly, Dr. Suprabhat Mukherjee, Dr. Debolina Sinha Banerjee, and Dr. Shreyasi Gupta, who addressed a range of topics spanning zoonotic diseases, public health, molecular pathology, and the socio-environmental impacts of disease emergence.

Furthering its academic outreach, the department also organized a national seminar on the theme "Protecting Wetlands for Our Common Future", on 15<sup>th</sup> February 2025, sponsored by the **East Kolkata Wetland Management Authority (EKWMA)**. The event featured two eminent speakers: Dr. Koutilya Bhattacharjee, Assistant Professor, UG & PG Department of Zoology, Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Centenary College, Rahara, and Dr. Arnab Ganguli, Assistant Professor, PG Department of Zoology, Banwarilal Bhalotia College, Asansol both of whom presented insightful discussions on the ecological significance of wetlands, threats to wetland biodiversity, and community-based conservation strategies.



### 2. Awareness Programs

The Postgraduate Department of Zoology organized a **Dengue Awareness Program** on 21<sup>st</sup> August 2024 to educate students and the local community about the prevention and control of dengue fever. The program included informative presentations and interactive sessions highlighting the life cycle of *Aedes* mosquitoes, symptoms of dengue, and effective measures for mosquito control.



### 3. Workshops

A one-day state-level workshop on "Scientific Writing and Perspectives of Biological and Environmental Manuscripts" was held on 2<sup>nd</sup> April 2025, aimed at enhancing academic writing skills and research communication among students and faculty members. The workshop featured **Dr. Sourav Paul**, Co-founder and Director of the *Estuarine and Coastal Studies Foundation (ECSF), Howrah, West Bengal*, as the resource person. Dr. Paul shared valuable insights into the structure, style, and ethics of scientific writing, with a focus on publishing in biological and environmental sciences. The interactive sessions provided practical guidance on manuscript preparation, journal selection, and responding to peer reviews. The workshop contributed significantly to building research capacity and fostering a culture of quality scientific publication in line with NAAC's emphasis on research and academic excellence.



## 4. Community Outreach Initiatives

The community outreach program was organized on 26<sup>th</sup> May, 2023 at KB High School, Ukhra, Paschim Bardhaman, centered on blood donation and awareness. The program highlighted the importance of voluntary blood donation, dispelled common myths, and encouraged youth participation in regular donation drives.




## INFRASTRUCTURE:

Spread across a sprawling 7.80088 acres, our college features a thoughtfully designed and student-centric environment, consisting of four main academic buildings and two dedicated administrative centres. The institution is equipped with 62 fully functional classrooms, including 15 ICT-enabled smart classrooms that enhance the teaching-learning experience. A well-stocked Central Library caters to the intellectual and academic needs of students and faculty, supporting research and scholastic growth. The campus promotes holistic development with a large playground with concrete fencing and entrance gate making it an attractive and secure recreational space. A canteen within the premises offers hygienic and affordable refreshments for students and staff. In line with our commitment to sustainability and environmental consciousness, solar panels have been installed, significantly reducing dependence on conventional energy sources. Statues of iconic thinkers and leaders—Swami Vivekananda, Rabindranath Tagore, Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose, and Ishwar Chandra Vidyasagar—grace the campus, serving as constant sources of inspiration. In alignment with the objectives of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, several infrastructure development projects are currently underway, including the construction of five new classrooms for the Hindi shift and six additional classrooms in the Arts and Humanities block to support growing enrollment and multidisciplinary learning. The long-cherished dream of college auditorium is now under active construction and is expected to be completed within the next two to three years, becoming a landmark facility for the institution. Furthermore, a dedicated space for Career Counselling Cell is being established to assist students with career planning and preparation for competitive examinations, with regular campus interviews and industry interaction programs aimed at enhancing employability and offering valuable placement opportunities. In alignment with the Government of India's educational reforms, the college is set to benefit from the One Nation One Subscription (ONOS) initiative, a Central Sector Scheme under the Ministry of Education (MoE), which has been implemented from January 2025. This initiative grants unified access to over 13,000 journals from 30 reputed publishers, significantly boosting academic and research capabilities across various disciplines.

### **OLD HERITAGE BUILDING:**

The main building, primarily accommodating the science and Commerce departments, holds the distinction of being the designated Old Heritage Building, inaugurated by Dr. Bidhan Chandra Roy, the then Chief Minister of West Bengal. This iconic structure comprises 72 rooms, including 37 classrooms and a seminar hall-cum-ICT classroom. It also houses the centres for distance education such as IGNOU and NSOU, extending learning opportunities beyond the conventional classroom. In a recent development, a new, state-of-the-art computer laboratory is being set up in Block-A, featuring 40 high-end computers to facilitate programming, data analysis, and IT-enabled learning across multiple academic disciplines. Additionally, the college seminar hall, Vivekananda Sabhagriha, has been attractively remodelled to better host seminars, webinars, workshops, student-teacher interaction programmes, and official meetings. The hall is now equipped with advanced audio-visual systems, high-speed internet, and a comfortable gallery-style seating arrangement, ensuring a modern and engaging space for academic and institutional activities.





### **HUMANITIES BUILDING**

This building houses all the Arts and Humanities departments. Apart from different departments, the Language lab is also situated in this building. It also accommodates the Digital Preservation Centre which works towards the digitization of old and rare historical documents. It has 29 rooms including 14 classrooms. An aesthetic flower garden adjacent to this building captures everyone's mind and sight. Recently, a butterfly garden has been constructed with the financial support of Department of Environment, Government of West Bengal, which has made the college environment eco-friendly and attractive.



### **BBA / BCA Building:**

This building houses departments that run the Professional Courses like BBA and BCA in the college. There are 12 rooms including 1 computer laboratory. This block also houses another separate library, catering to the specific requirements of students enrolled in the said courses. It further accommodates the NCC wing of the college, the Boys' Common Room and the Students' Union Room.

### **ADMINISTRATIVE AND CENTRAL LIBRARY BUILDING:**

The old administrative building houses the office of the Head-clerk. It also accommodates the Girls' Common Room. Our new Administrative Building was inaugurated by Sri Moloy Ghatak, Governing Body President, Banwarilal Bhalotia College, Asansol & Minister-In-Charge, Govt, of West Bengal in 2015. It houses the Principal's Chamber, the IQAC Office, Accounts Section & new Central Library. In addition, this building features a well-equipped, LAN- enabled computer laboratory primarily utilized for online examinations and student training. Central Library, a state-of- the-art knowledge hub that offers continuous academic support to all stakeholders is also housed in this building. In a progressive move to extend the reach of education, access to the library's reading room has also been granted to external users. To further assist students in achieving their academic and career goals, the library maintains



a dedicated collection of reference materials for competitive examinations such as UPSC, SSC, and banking. Moreover, the college provides free online coaching through smart interactive classrooms, creating an engaging and effective learning environment for all learners.



**HINDI SHIFT BUILDING:** The Hindi Shift facilitates scholarly pursuits where Hindi is the medium of instruction. It is housed in a separate building adjacent to the main campus and consists of 5 classrooms and 1 seminar hall. In a bid to cater to the needs of ever-increasing number of students in our Hindi Shift, the college has enhanced the infrastructure by adding 4 large rooms on the second floor of the Hindi Shift building. Recently, an approach road of pavers block has been constructed through the adjacent garden. Many trees have been planted and beautification initiatives have been taken to make the garden attractive.

#### **BOYS' HOSTEL:**

The Boys' Hostel is one of the oldest buildings in our college. There are around 32 rooms which house more than 85 students in this hostel.



#### **GIRLS' HOSTEL:**

Promila Devi Women's Hostel is another beautiful addition to our infrastructure. There are around 38 rooms in this building. About 100 girls have made our hostel their home away from home.

#### **LABORATORIES:**

The college is equipped with 21 spacious and well-maintained laboratories across various departments including Chemistry, Physics, Botany, Zoology, Microbiology, Electronics, Environmental Science, and Geography, all furnished with modern instruments to meet the demands of the current curriculum and beyond. The Physics and Zoology departments also feature dedicated post-graduate laboratories. In addition, the institution houses well-equipped Computer Laboratories, including a central computer lab with a peer-to-peer network and internet access, supporting students in fulfilling essential curriculum requirements. In the post-COVID period, several advanced instruments have been added to enhance the teaching-learning experience, making it more realistic and engaging. As part of the implementation of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, laboratories are currently being upgraded with the procurement of modern equipment and improvements in infrastructure to foster hands-on learning, innovation, and research excellence across disciplines.



### ICT INFRASTRUCTURE:

The college has made significant strides in strengthening its ICT infrastructure to support both academic and administrative functions. A fully online admission system and the modernization of ICT facilities in administrative offices reflect the institution's commitment to digital advancement. Fourteen classrooms and seminar halls are now equipped with smart boards, projectors, screens, and high-end computers to facilitate dynamic and interactive teaching-learning experiences. In addition to departmental computers, a Central Computing Facility with approximately 120 systems serves as a vital resource for students and faculty, particularly aiding in the smooth conduct of online internal examinations. The college also boasts a functional Language Laboratory aimed at enhancing students' communication skills, especially in English, equipped with nine computer systems and the advanced Sanako software. A new, state-of-the-art computer lab is being developed in Block-A with 40 high-end computers to support programming, data analysis, and IT-enabled learning across disciplines. Our ICT preparedness proved invaluable during the COVID-19 lockdown, allowing uninterrupted academic activity through online classes, assignments, pre-recorded lectures, and access to open educational resources via a dedicated web page on the college website. This initiative was widely appreciated by students and the Higher Education Department, Government of West Bengal. In a major upgrade, the "Vivekananda Sabhagriha" seminar hall has been enhanced with modern audio-visual systems, high-speed internet, and comfortable seating arrangements, enabling the smooth conduct of seminars, webinars, workshops, and other academic interactions. Furthering our digital connectivity, the college has launched its official mobile application, *BB College e-Connect*, available on the Play Store, which offers easy access to academic and administrative information for students and staff alike, thus strengthening communication and digital engagement across the institution.



## BEYOND THE CLASSROOM: CO-CURRICULAR AND SOCIO-CULTURAL INITIATIVES

The college is committed to the holistic development of its students, recognising the importance of nurturing intellectual, cultural, and social sensibilities. A diverse range of cultural activities, competitive events, and programmes addressing social issues are integrated into the curriculum as essential components of a well-rounded education.

### Birth/Death Anniversaries of Eminent Indians

Such events are celebrated to imbibe and exhibit Indian cultural and patriotic values among one and all. The birth anniversaries of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose, Rabindranath Tagore, Mahatma Gandhi, and Kazi Nazrul Islam, among others, are observed with due respect. National Youth Day is celebrated every year on the birth anniversary of Swami Vivekananda. The College also remembers Rabindranath Tagore and Shahid Khudiram Bose on their death anniversaries. Besides reminding our students of the contribution of eminent personalities to our nation, the college is committed to inspiring a spirit of national integration and patriotism among its students and staff. Thus, occasions like Independence Day and Republic Day are observed on campus with due care.



### International Yoga Day

The college is deeply concerned about the physical and mental health of its students and staff. International Yoga Day is observed to spread awareness of the benefits of Yoga and encourage students to engage in the same.

***Self-Defence Training Programme***




### Blood Donation Camp:

**Beagle Club**




Netaji Subhas Open University (NSOU) is the premier State Open University in India. The year 1997 marked the birth centenary of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose. On this occasion, the Hon'ble Chief Minister of West Bengal announced the establishment of an Open University in Netaji's name. Accordingly, a State Act—W.B. Act (XIX) of 1997—was passed on 20th August 1997, and the university was recognized by the UGC. NSOU became the 14th Open University in the country and the 13th among the State Open Universities. It began its journey in July 1998 with a Bachelor's Degree Programme (BDP) in Arts and Commerce.

The B. B. College Learner Support Centre (LSC) of NSOU has been functional since the inception of the university, initially offering only Arts and Commerce subjects. In 2014, Honours courses in all Science subjects were introduced. At present, the centre offers eleven Honours subjects across Arts, Science, and Commerce streams: Bengali, English, Education, Political Science, History, Accountancy, Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Geography, Zoology, and Botany. The University adopted the **Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)** for undergraduate programs from the academic year 2021–2022. **From the upcoming academic session, the University is tentatively set to begin undergraduate programmes aligned with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020**, ensuring a more flexible and multidisciplinary approach to higher education.

#### **Several postgraduate courses are also running successfully at the centre. These include:**

**Arts and Humanities:** Bengali (PGBG), English (PGE), English Language Teaching (PGET), History (PGHI), Political Science (PGPS), Public Administration (PGPA), Education (PGED)

**Science and Commerce:** Mathematics (PGMT), Commerce (M.Com.)

**Professional Programs:** Social Work (MSW), Library and Information Science (MLIS), Journalism and Mass Communication (PGJM)

#### **Other Professional Courses Offered:**

The centre also offers a range of professional programs, including:

Bachelor in Library and Information Science (BLIS)

Postgraduate Diploma in Journalism and Mass Communication (PGDJMC)

Postgraduate Diploma in Public Relations and Advertising (PGDPR&Ad)

Postgraduate Diploma in English Language Teaching (PGDELT)

#### **Counseling and Induction:**

However, for some subjects, there is no fixed counseling venue; the University endeavors to arrange these sessions at the nearest available support centres for the convenience of learners.

## **From the desk of the Coordinator, IGNOU study centre**

The Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU), established by an Act of Parliament in 1985, has continuously striven to build an inclusive knowledge society through inclusive education. It has tried to increase the Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) of the country by offering high-quality teaching through the Open and Distance Learning (ODL) mode. **Maulana Azad National Urdu University (MANUU)** is a Central University, established by an Act of Parliament in 1998 with all India jurisdiction. The headquarters and main campus of MANUU is in Gachibowli, Hyderabad. It is spread over 200 acres. MANUU is recognized as a major higher education service provider across the remote areas of the country in Urdu Medium through its regular and distance mode programs. MANUU commenced with distance education programs in 1998 and consolidated its academic and research programs in 2004.

**The University is named after Maulana Abul Kalam Azad**, a scholar par excellence, a prolific writer, an inimitable orator, a gallant freedom fighter, a visionary of the post independent Indian education system and an architect of technical and scientific education in Independent India.

Presently, MANUU is in the process of consolidating the existing institutions, while expanding it to reach the unreached through various intervention measures. Further, to meet the rising aspirations of its youth in general and Urdu speaking community in specific, the University is making considerable progress in all fronts of academics, research and governance with specific vision, mission and objectives.

### **Vision**

To provide access to quality education through Urdu as medium of instruction, while adhering to the inclusive policy

### **Mission**

To empower socially, economically, educationally and culturally marginalized sections of the society so that they are brought into the mainstream, and thereby contribute to the socio-economic development of the nation through formal and non-formal modes of educational delivery.

### **Medium of Instruction and Examinations**

#### **As per the Ordinance under MANUU Act:**

The question papers for all examinations shall be set and answered in Urdu language subject to the condition that question papers for all examinations in languages shall be set and answered in the respective languages. The University is in the process of fulfilling the Performance Radars stipulated by the UGC for norm based funding which reflects the quantifiable indicators on the all-round development and growth of the University in terms of Academic, Research and Governance functions.

The University has initiated its distance mode programmes from its year of inception. The DDE has set up 9 Regional Centres (Delhi, Patna, Bangalore, Bhopal, Darbhanga, Srinagar, Kolkatta, Mumbai, Ranchi) and 5 Sub-Regional Centres (Hyderabad, Jammu, Amravati, Lucknow, Nuh) across the country so as to provide academic and administrative support to the students.

**DIRECTORATE OF DISTANCE EDUCATION** Directorate of Distance Education (DDE) started its functioning from 1998, the year of inception of the university with distance mode BA program. At present, the Directorate offers UGC - Distance Education Bureau (DEB) approved distance mode programs at various levels viz., three PG (MA in Urdu, English and History); four UG programs (BA, BS.c -Life Science, B.Sc. -Physical Science and B.Ed); two Diplomas (Diploma in Journalism and Mass Communication, Diploma in Teach English) and Two certificate programs (Proficiency in English through English and Functional English for Urdu Speakers). The Directorate plans to re-start B.Com. and M.A. (Islamic Studies), and to introduce new programs - MA (Arabic) and MA (Hindi) and few Diploma programs from the academic year 2018. The Directorate has set-up network of nine regional centers (at Bengaluru, Bhopal, Darbhanga, Delhi, Kolkata, Mumbai, Patna, Ranchi, Srinagar) and five Sub-regional centers (at Hyderabad, Lucknow, Jammu, Nuh and Amravati) to provide student support services and management of 158 Learners Support Centers spread across the country. The University has signed MoUs with some TV channels for imparting lessons to students through audio-visual media. The Directorate also endeavoring to achieve the goals providing online admissions, audio-visual aids along with printed Self Learning Material. All the programs are of DDE are offered on annual system. The University conducts term end examinations for all above mentioned programs offered by DDE every year. The Degrees, Diploma, Certificates awarded by the University are at par with the certificates of other Central Universities. As on date, there are approximately 40,000 students on DDE's rolls.
